## Is Your Business Ready for Industry 4.0?

Under this national policy, there is the Industry4*WRD* readiness assessment, where qualified and trained assessors will help you to understand if you are ready for the adoption of Industry 4.0. After the assessment, they will provide recommendations on where you should start your transformation.

Those who are eligible for this readiness assessment are companies in the manufacturing and related services sector, with valid registration and business licenses. The companies must have at least 60% local equity, and have been in operation for at least 3 years.

You might be wondering how a readiness assessment will benefit you. For starters, it will help you to identify areas that require improvement, especially in terms of people, processes and technology. A comprehensive readiness report will be produced for your reference and understanding. You will also be eligible to apply for financial incentives.

A total of 500 companies were supposed to be selected for free assessments in 2019 and 450 more in 2020. If you are not selected to receive a free assessment, you can still obtain tax exemption on readiness assessment fees of up to RM27,000.
