THE 51ST ASEAN DAY & BUSINESS FORUM “UNLOCKING THE POTENTIALS OF ASEAN e-COMMERCE”

The Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) is organising the 51st ASEAN Day, in conjunction with the 51st Anniversary of ASEAN on 8 August 2018 (Wednesday) at MITI Tower, Kuala Lumpur.

2. The programme includes a flag raising ceremony; Business Forum; and exhibition booths.
3. The theme of the Business Forum “Unlocking the Potentials of ASEAN e-Commerce” is chosen with the following objectives:
 - to create awareness among Malaysian business communities on the opportunities arising from the implementation of the ASEAN e-Commerce Agreement which has been finalised and is scheduled to be signed at the ASEAN Summit in November 2018; and
 - to update key stakeholders on the extensive work undertaken to drive the e-Commerce agenda, both in Malaysia and ASEAN.
4. The Business Forum is attended by approximately 500 SMEs, exporters, industry representatives and e-Commerce players. A key feature of the Forum is a panel discussion with successful e-Commerce entrepreneurs and prominent players in e-Commerce ecosystem. They will share their experience and perspectives on prospects in e-Commerce in Malaysia as well as in ASEAN.
5. The ASEAN e-Commerce Agreement aims to:
 - facilitate cross-border e-Commerce transactions in ASEAN;
 - contribute to creating an environment of trust and confidence in the use of e-Commerce in ASEAN; and
