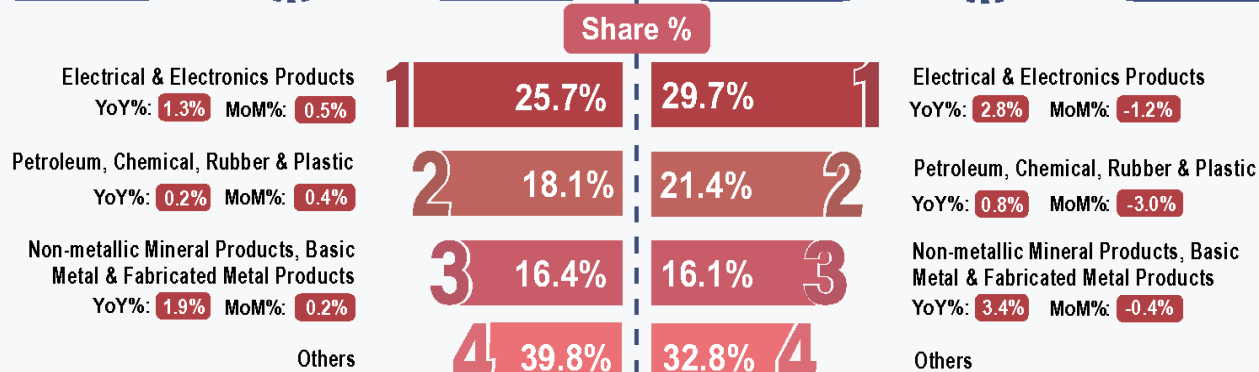
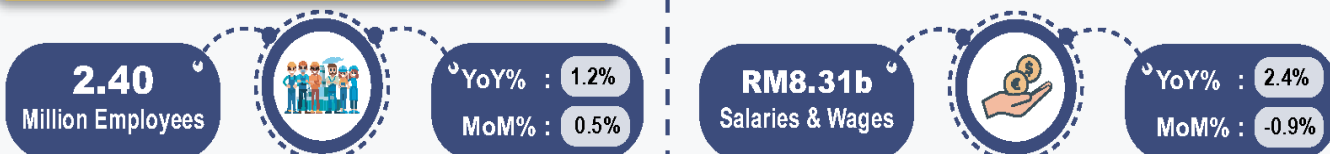
Sales Value of the Manufacturing Sector



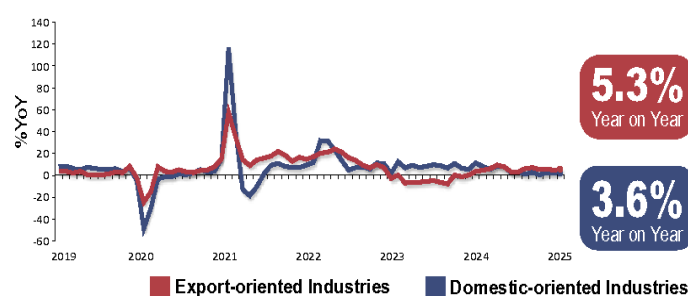
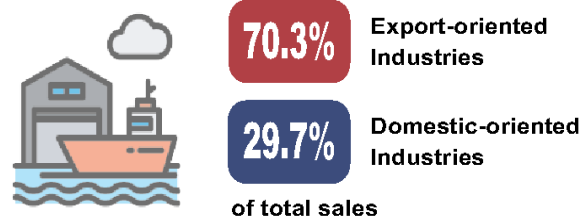

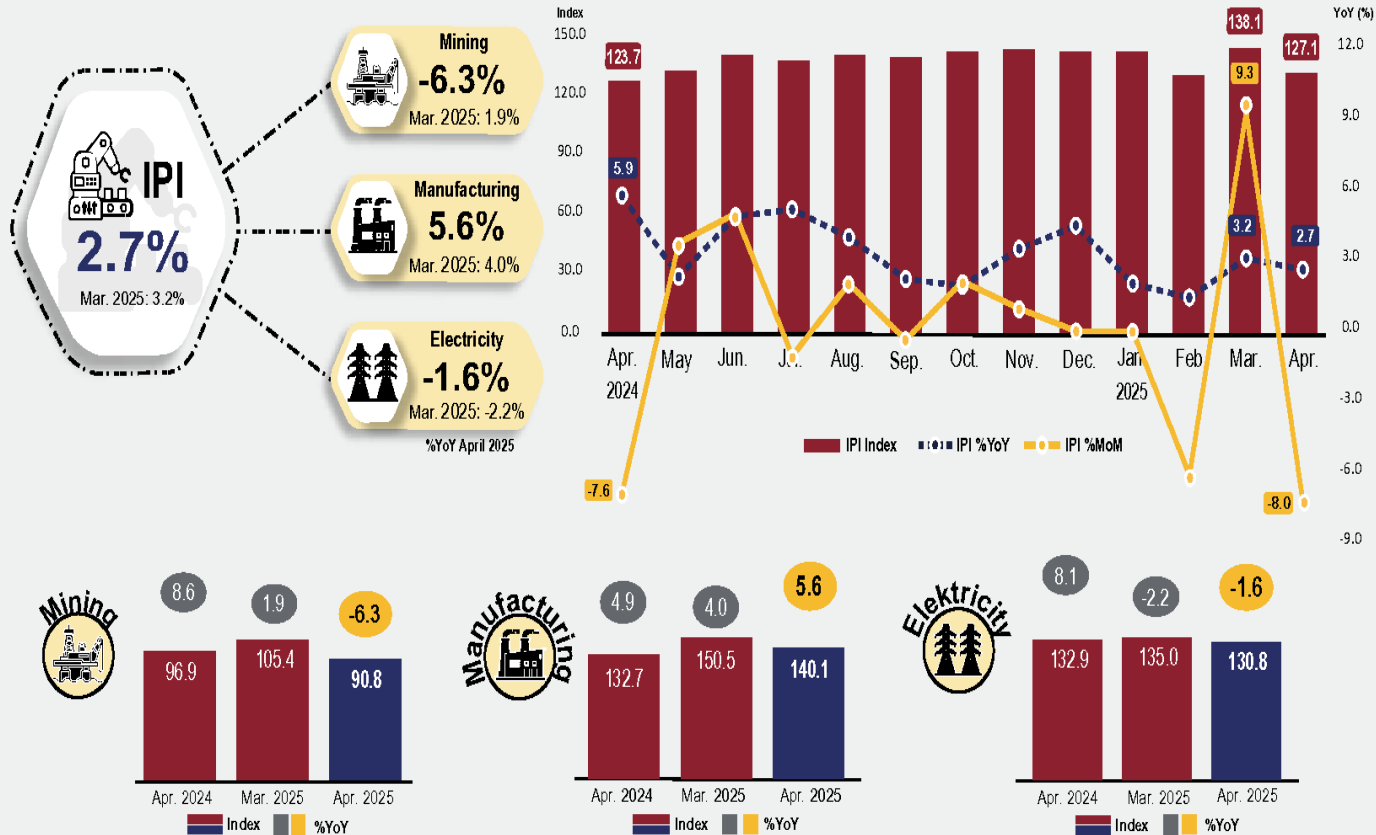

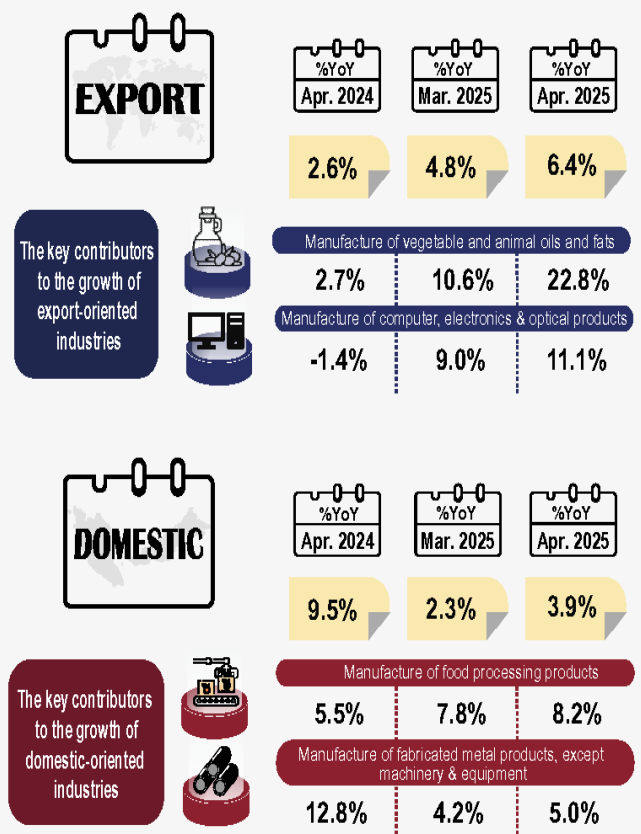
INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION INDEX APRIL 2025

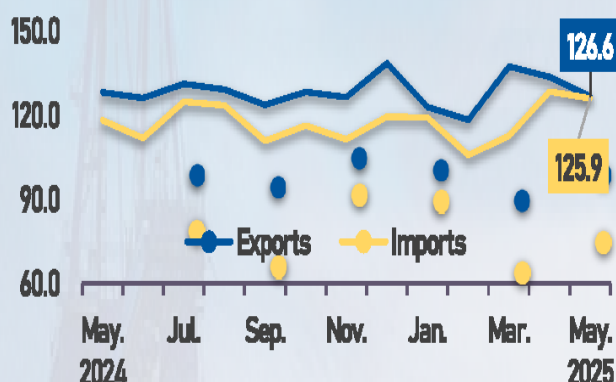

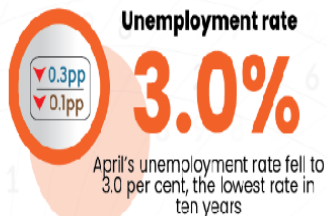

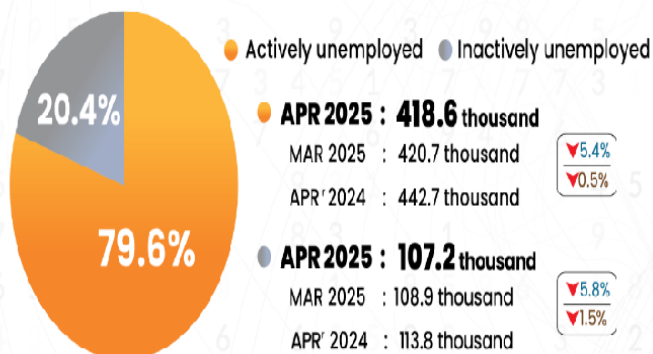

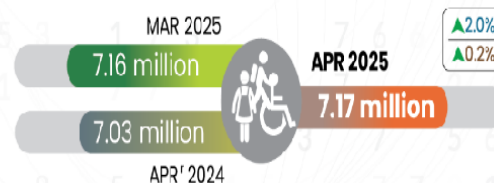

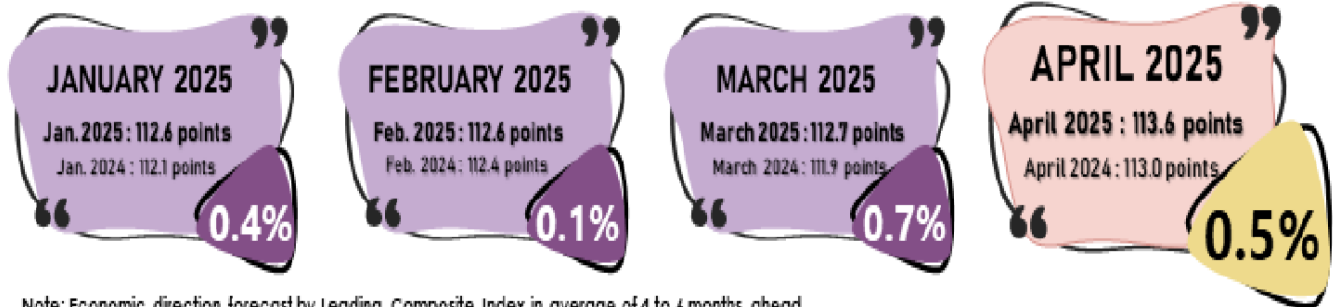

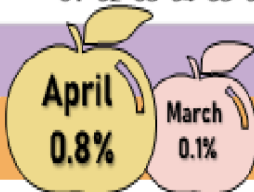

Leading Composite Index (2015=100) and Annual Change (%)



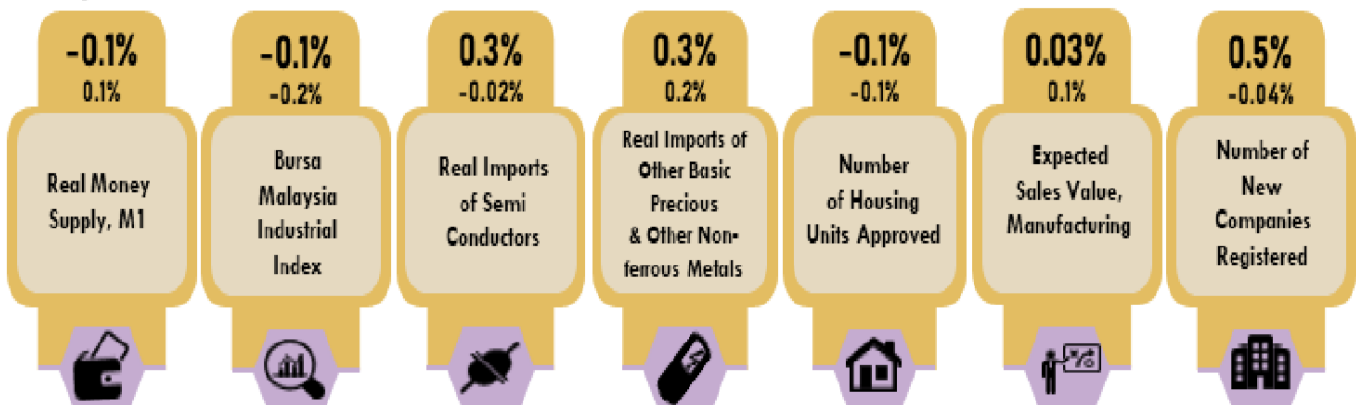

Contribution of Each Component to the Percentage Change in the Leading Composite Index from the Previous Month



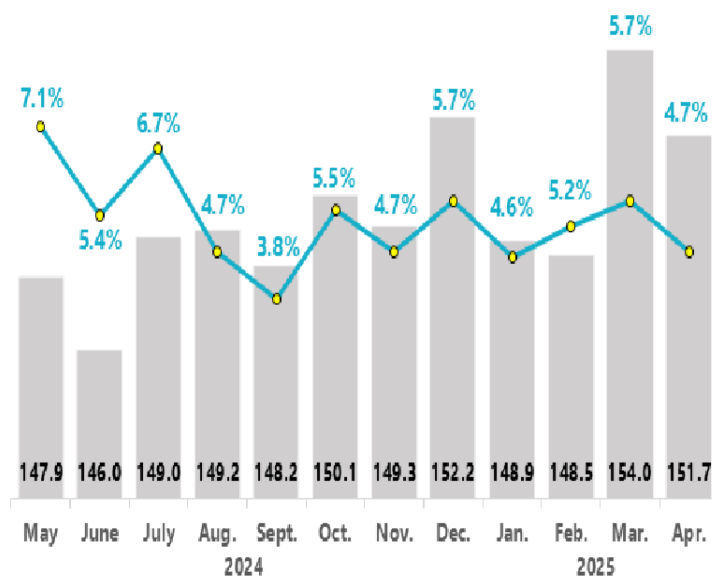

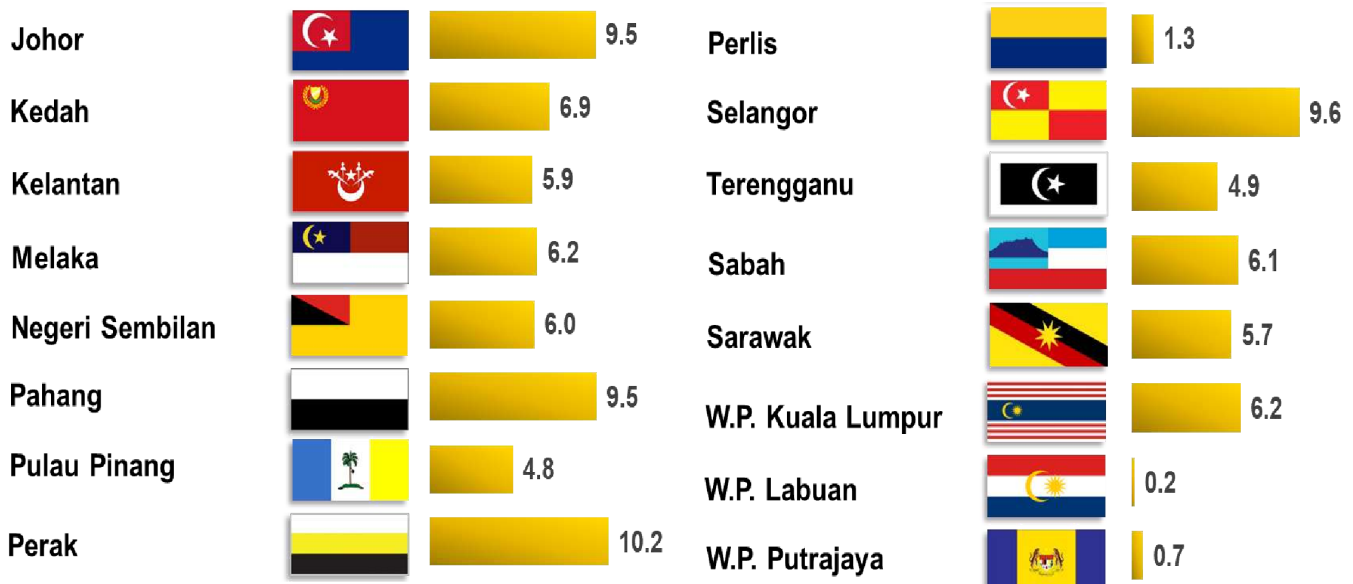
5 Main Purposes of Trips by Domestic Visitors



5 Expenditure Components of Domestic Visitors



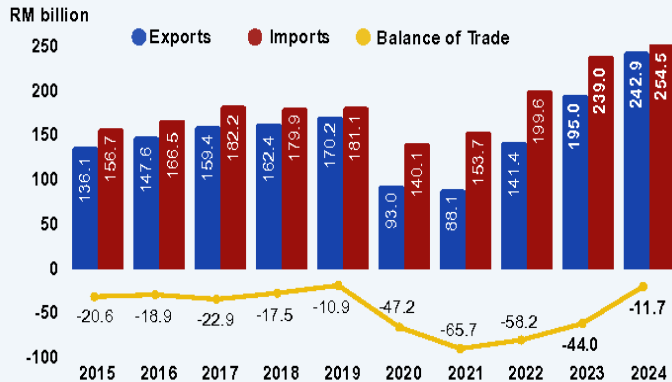

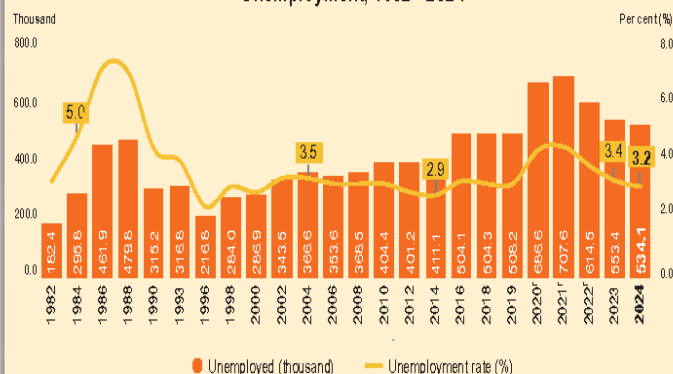

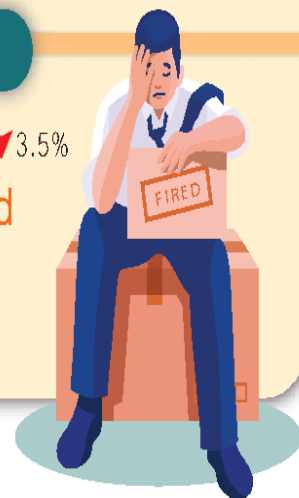

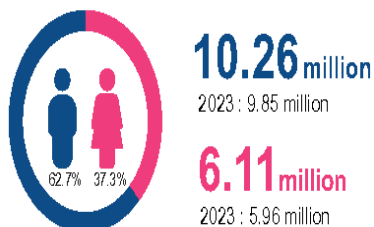

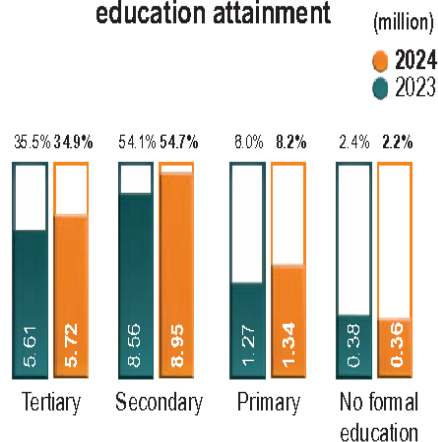

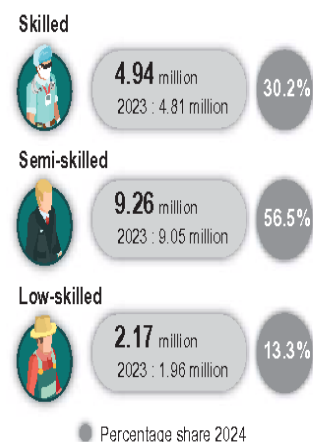

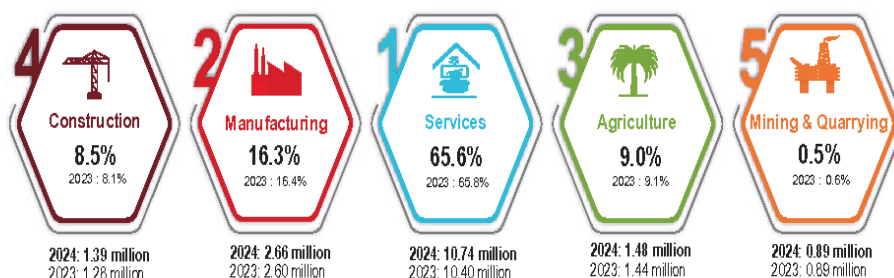
Employed persons by education attainment

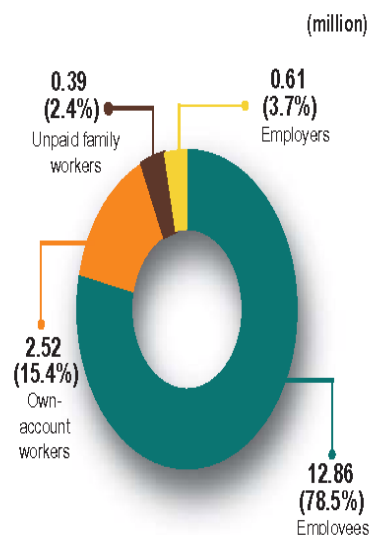

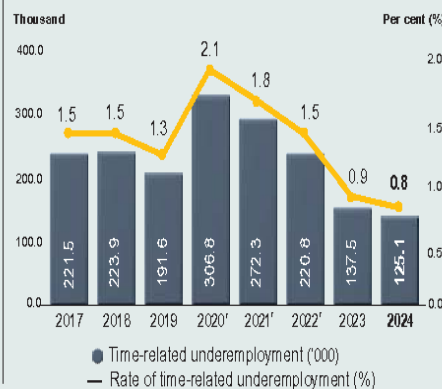

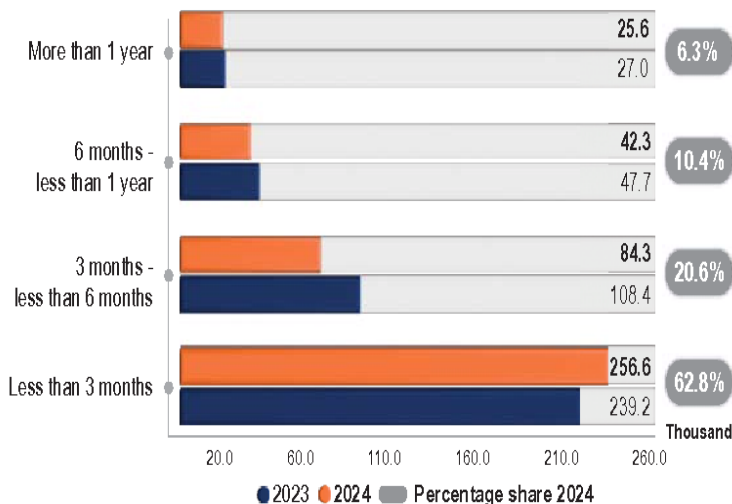

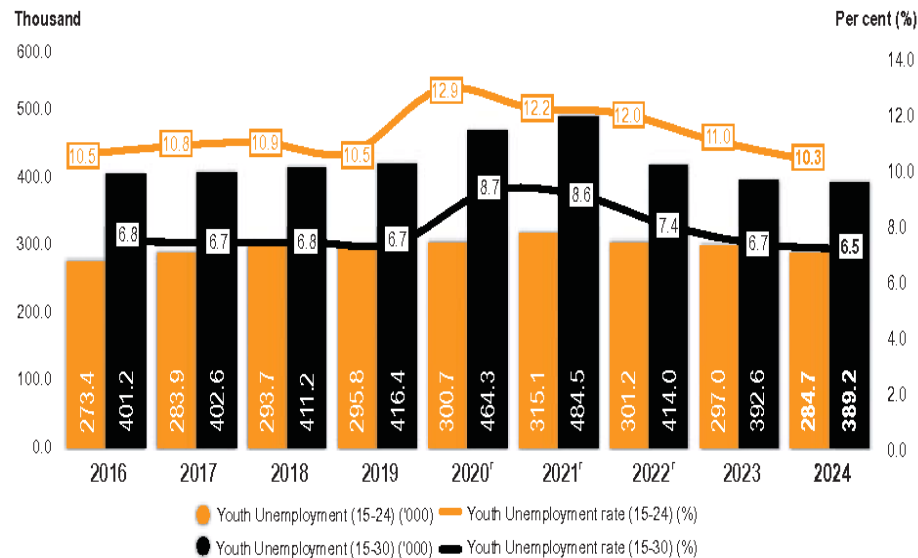

Youth unemployment, 2016-2024

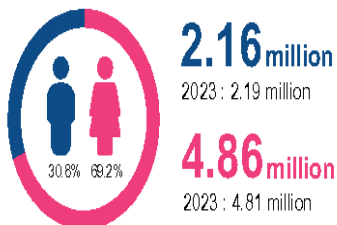

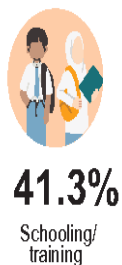
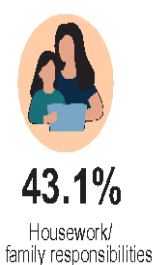
Major composition of outside labour force by sex was female



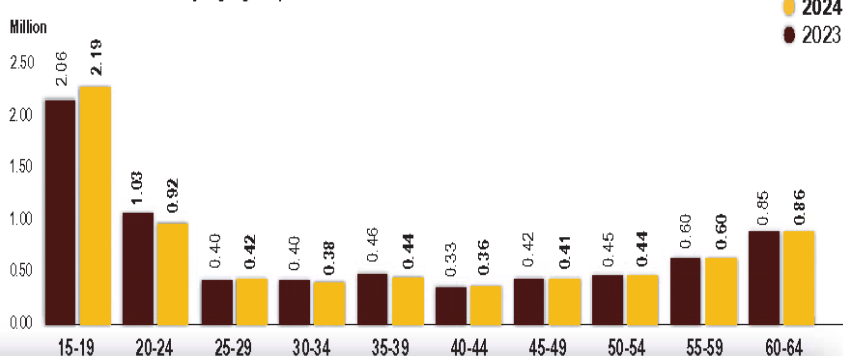
Share of outside labour force by reasons for not seeking work

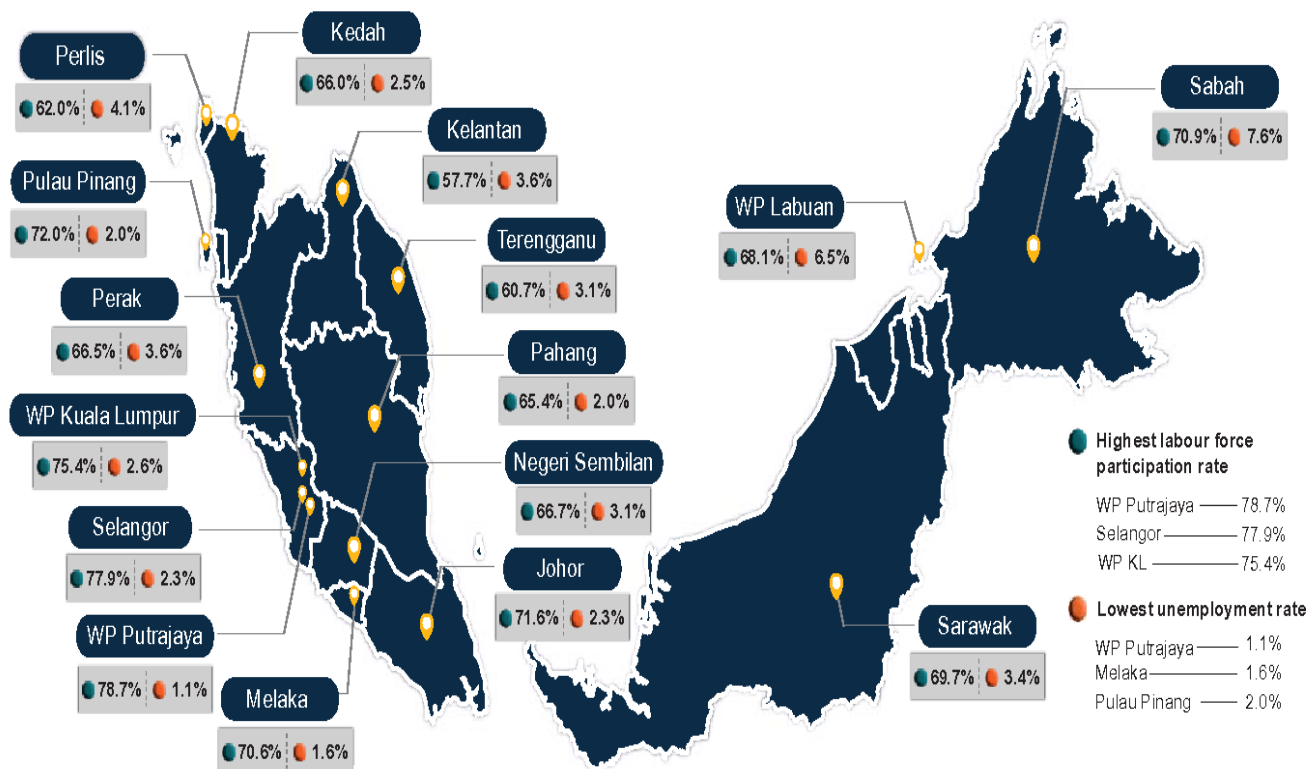


Outside labour force by age group

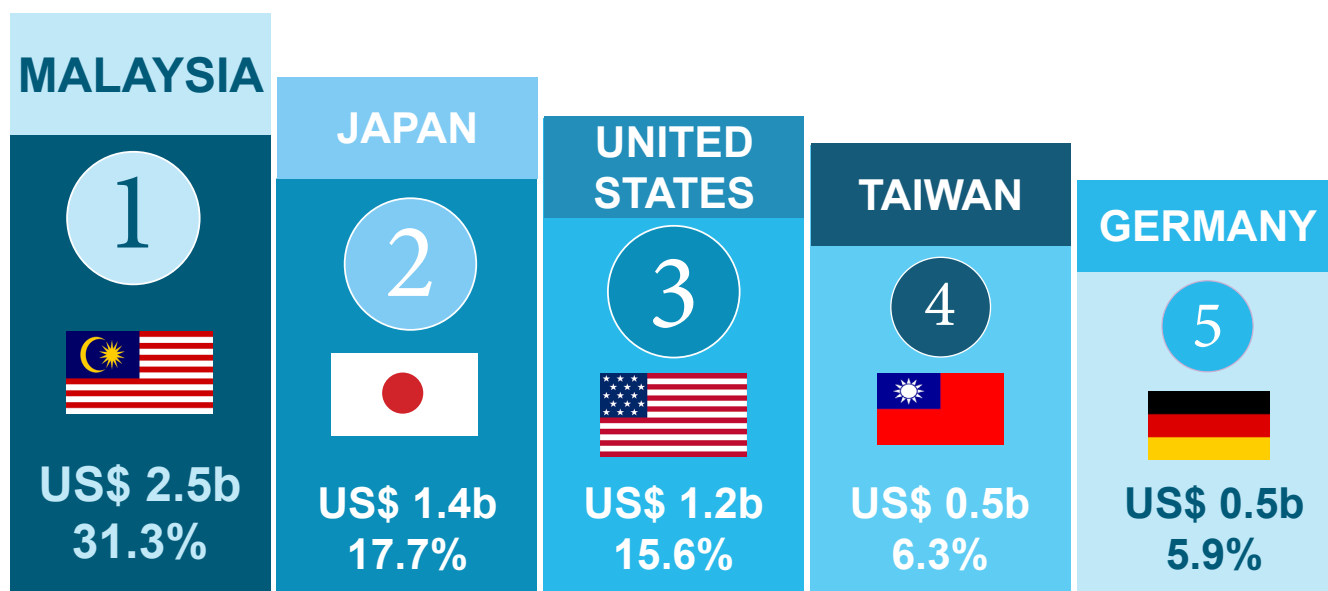

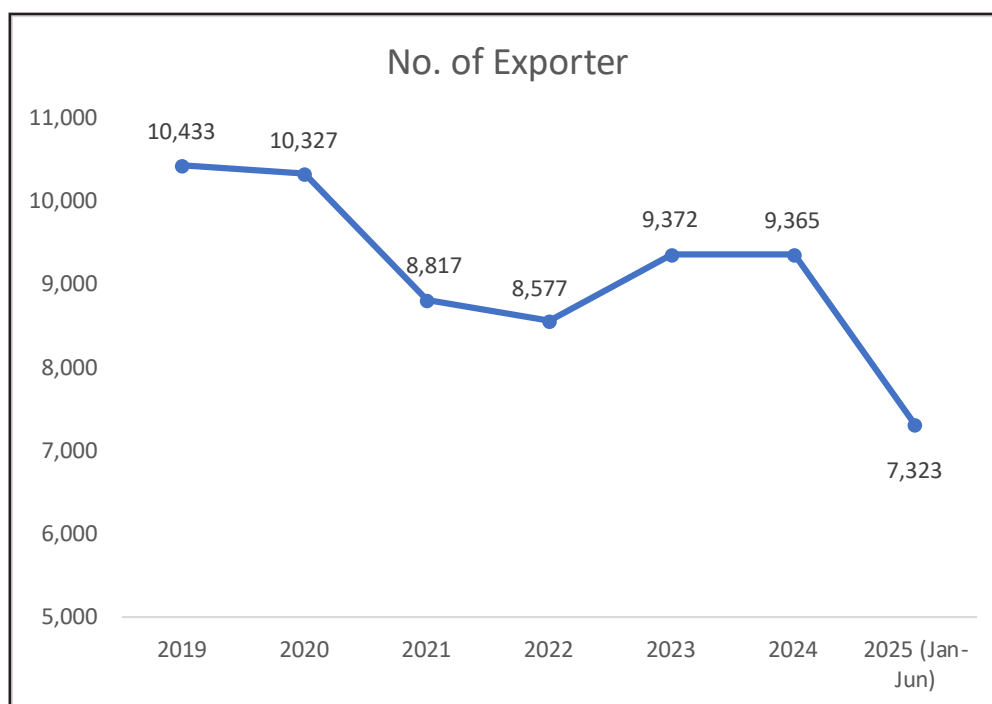


Number of Exporter using Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs) as at June 2025
