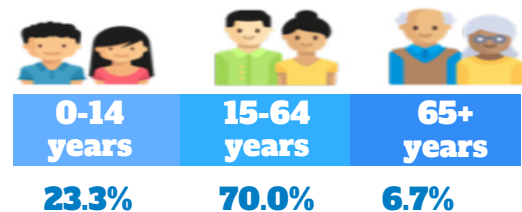

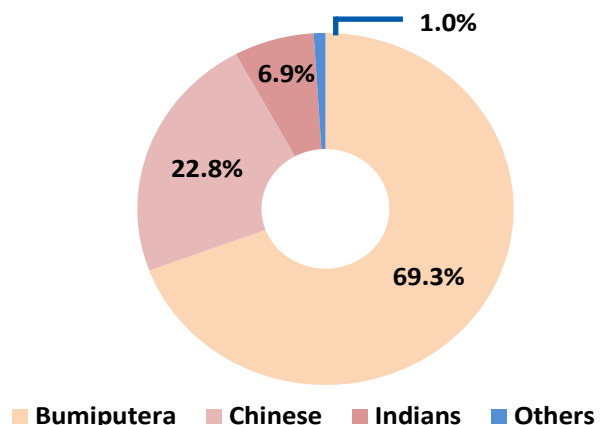

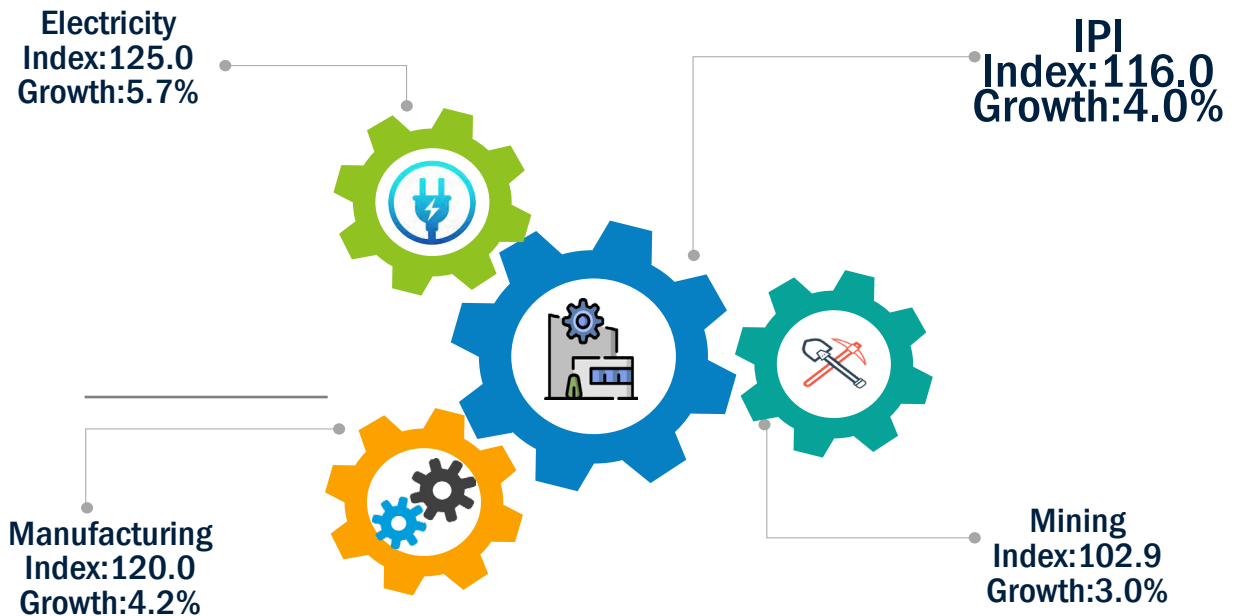

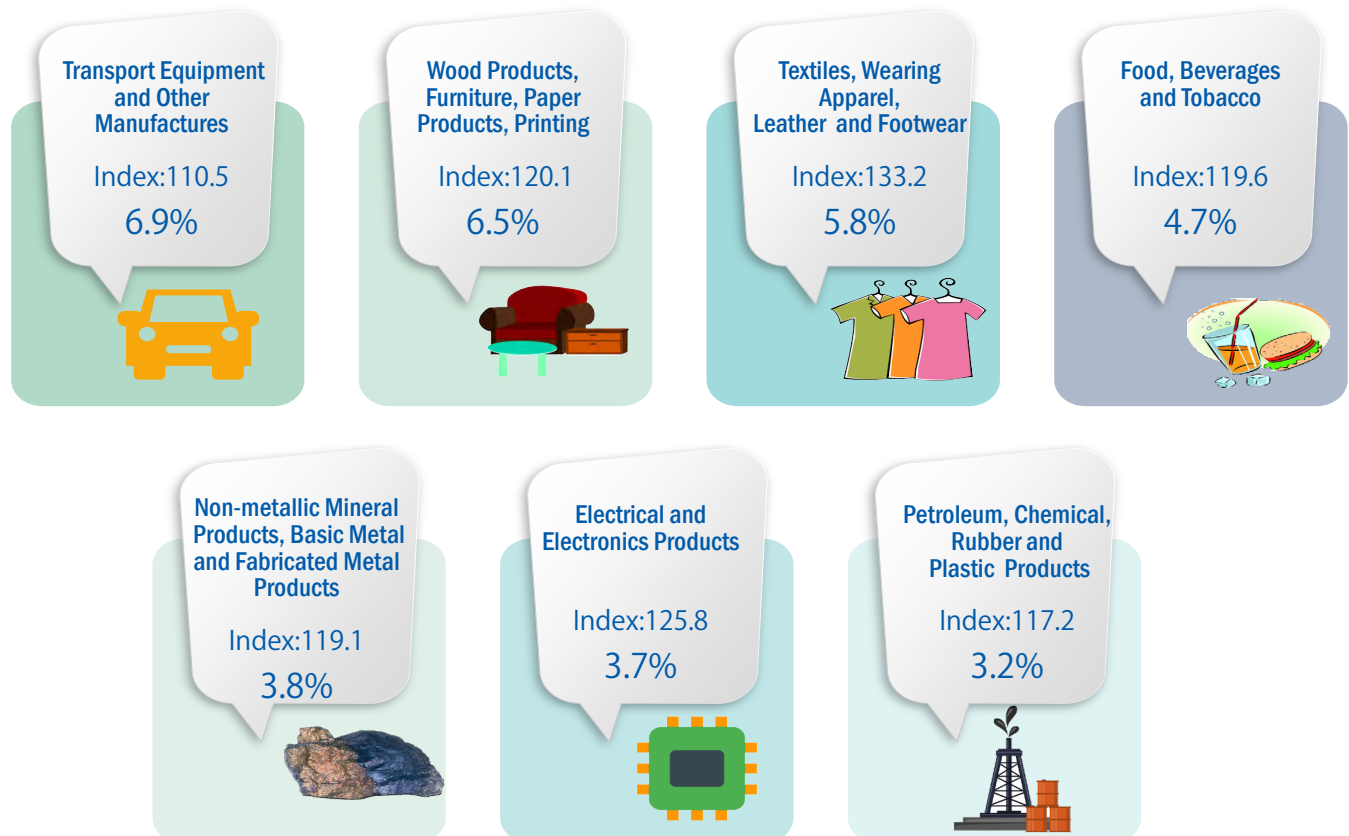

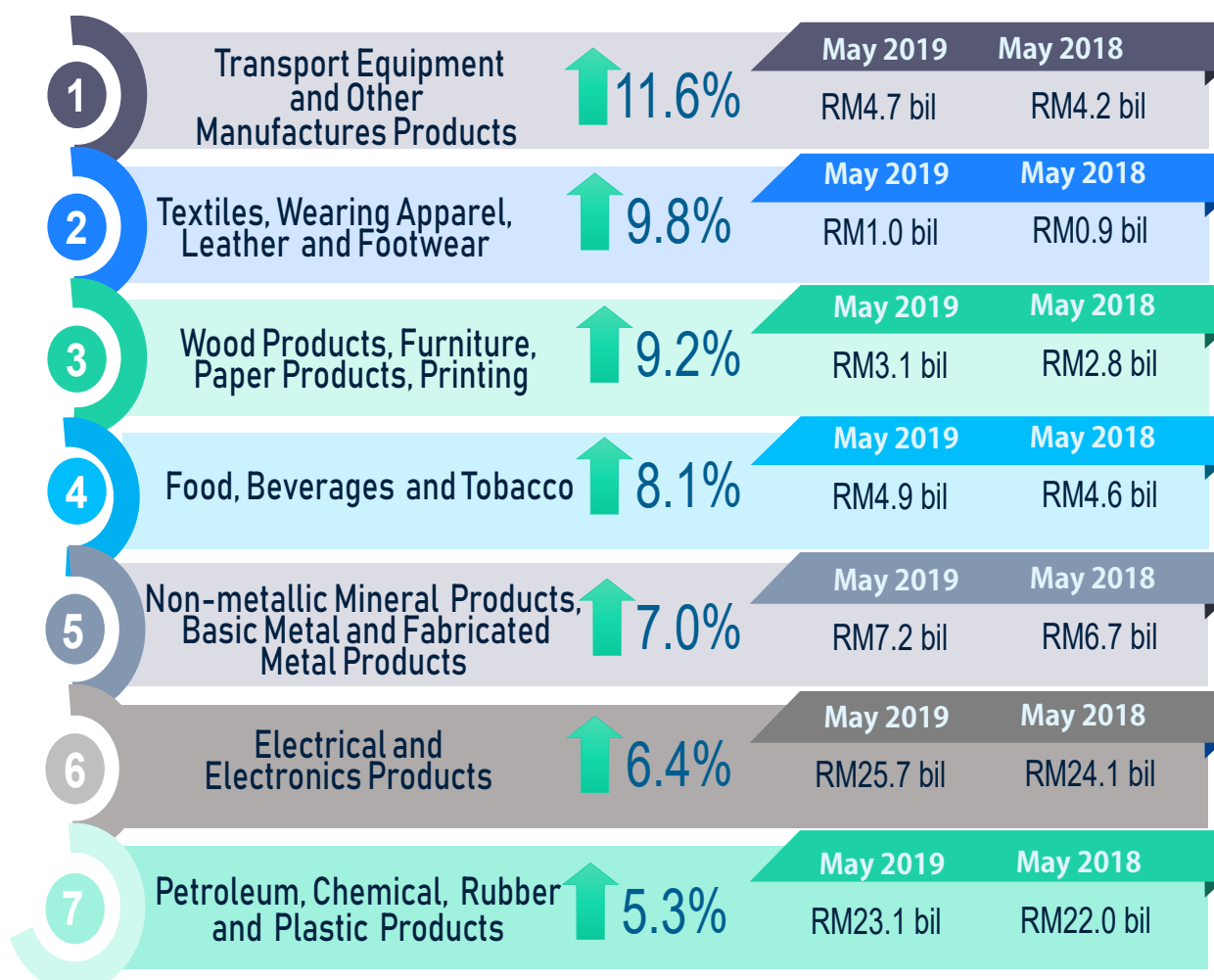

SALES VALUE OF SEVEN SUB-SECTORS, IN MAY 2019

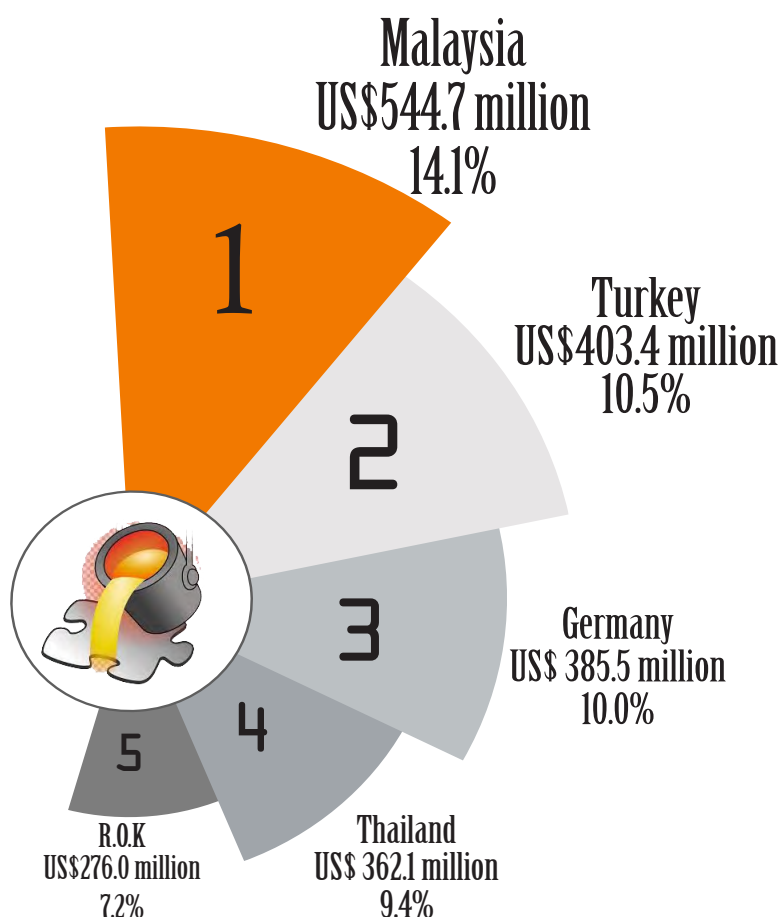

WORLD LARGEST EXPORTERS OF WIRE OF REFINED COPPER*, 2018



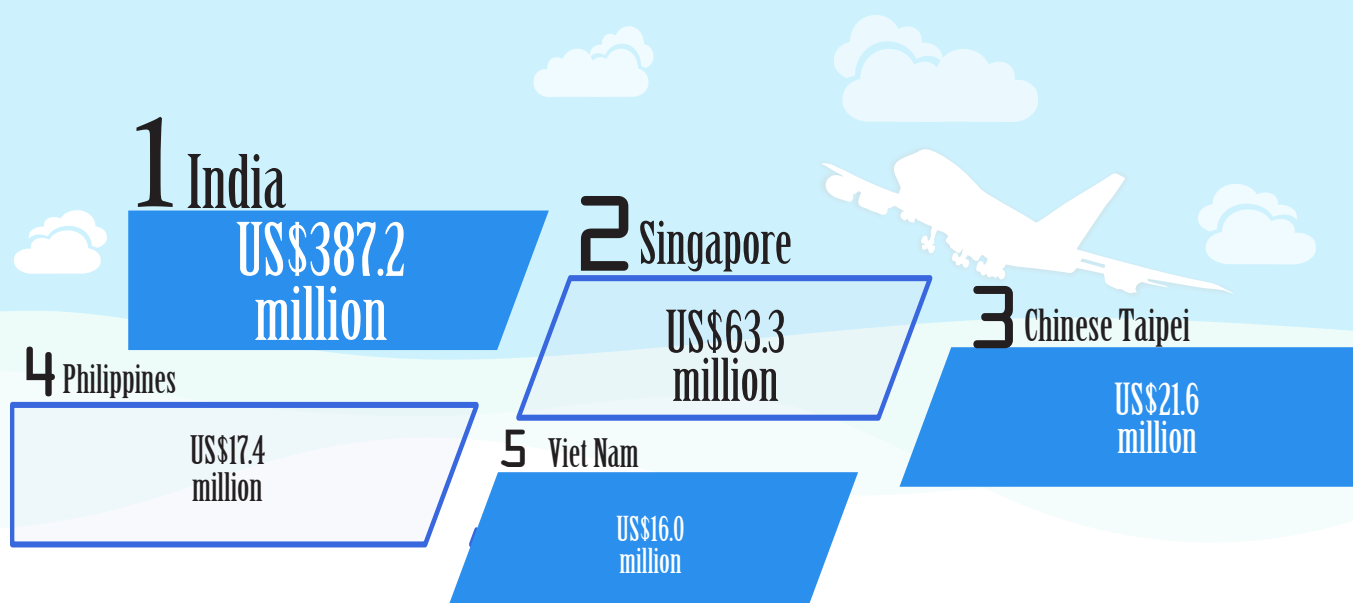

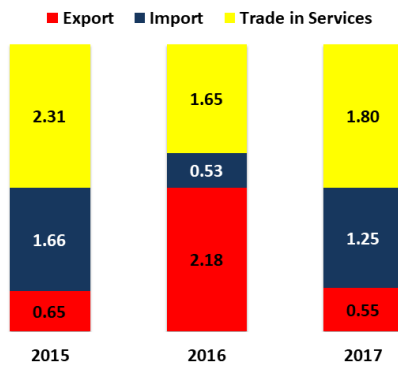

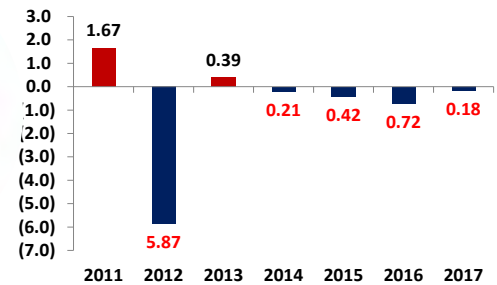


BRUNEI Trade In Services (US\$billion)



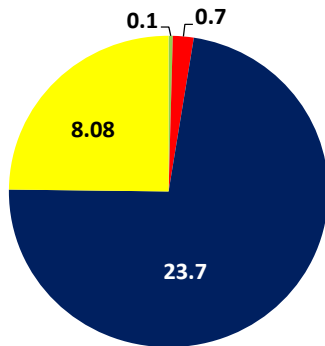

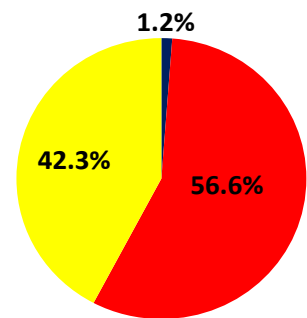


BRUNEI Gross Domestic Product

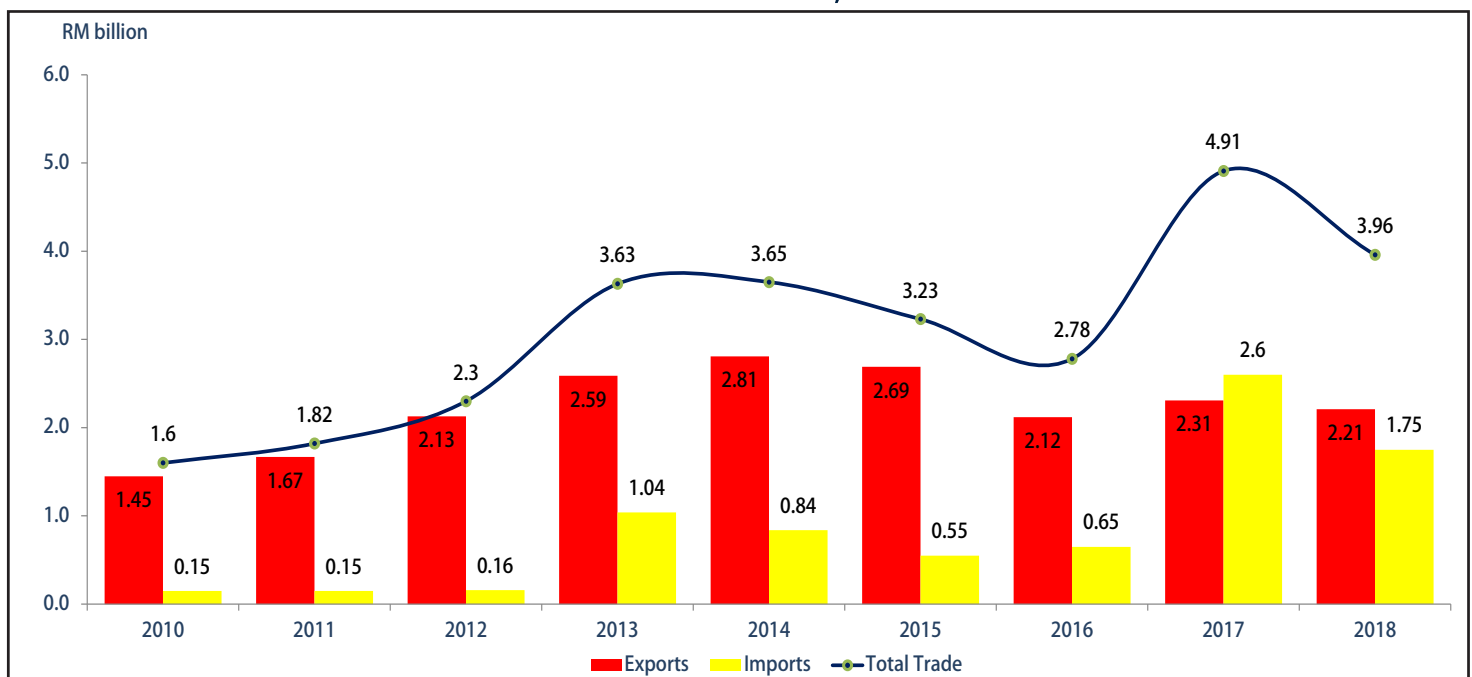

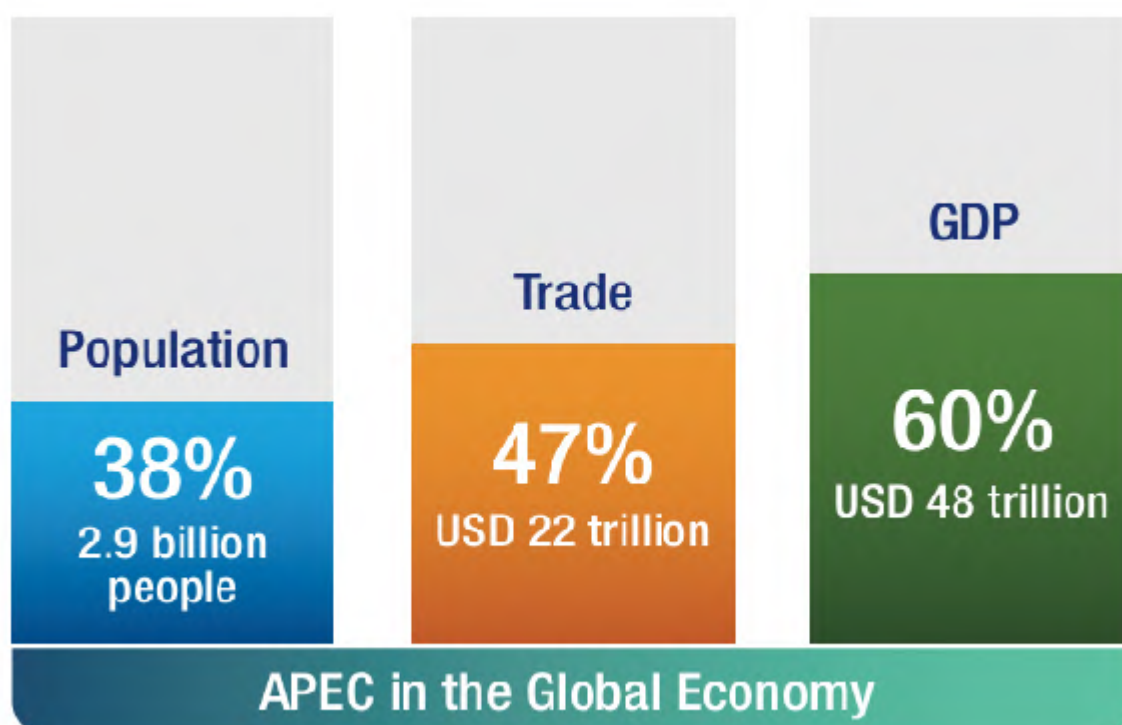
APEC at a Glance

The Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) is a group of 21 economies located in the Asia-Pacific region that are dedicated to achieving a shared prosperity through economic growth and free trade.

Officials from APEC economies convene every year, throughout the year, to discuss ways to facilitate trade and promote sustainable economic growth across the region. During these meetings, everyone is equal: big and small economies work side-by-side to develop workable solutions to trade and investment barriers.

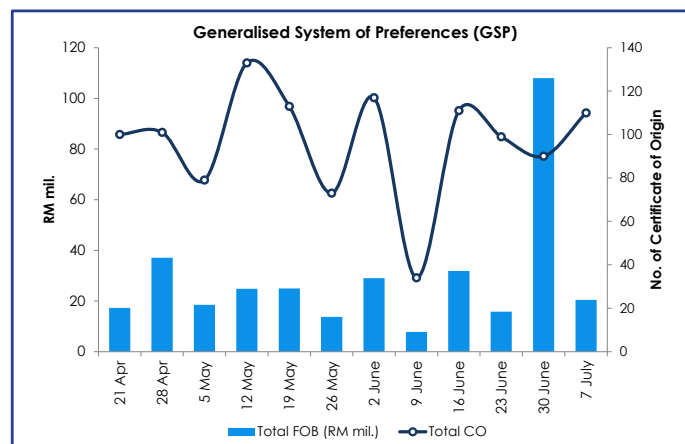
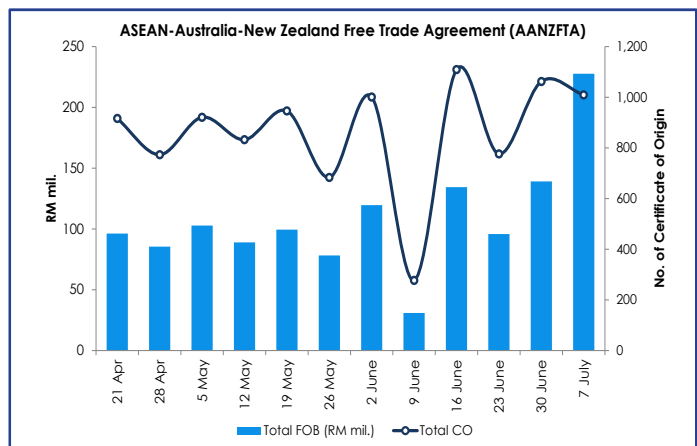
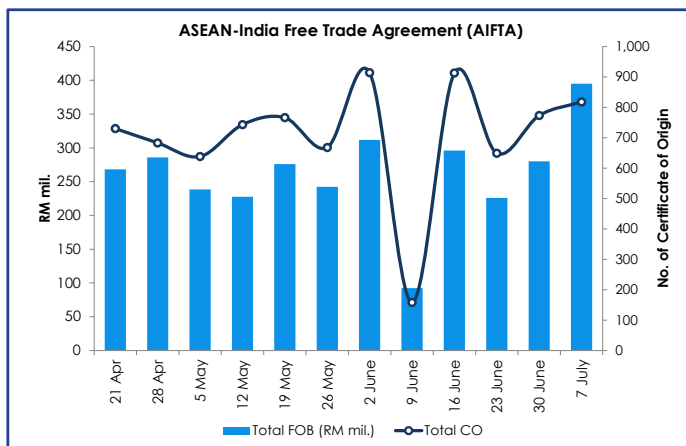
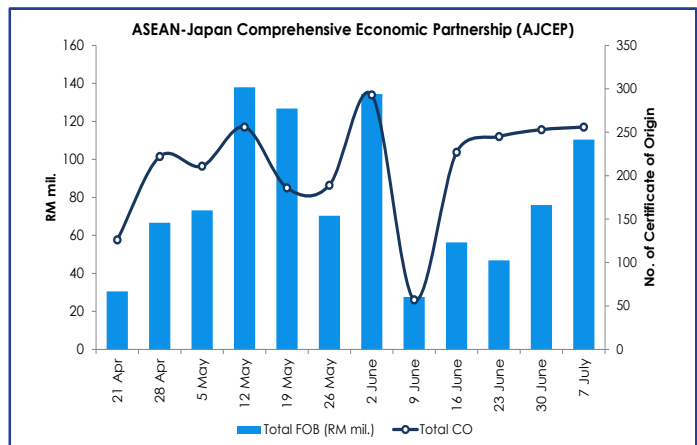
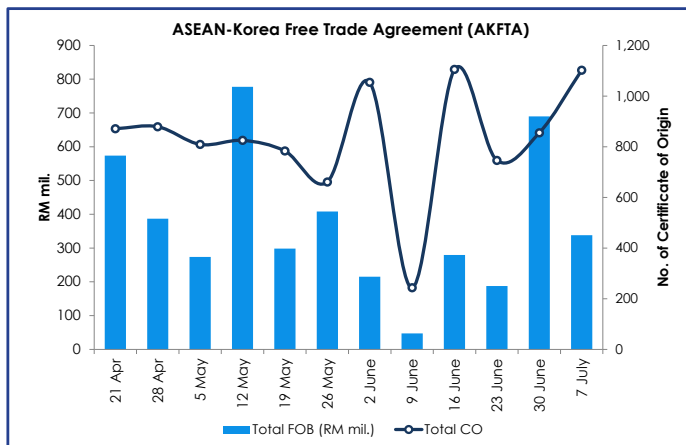
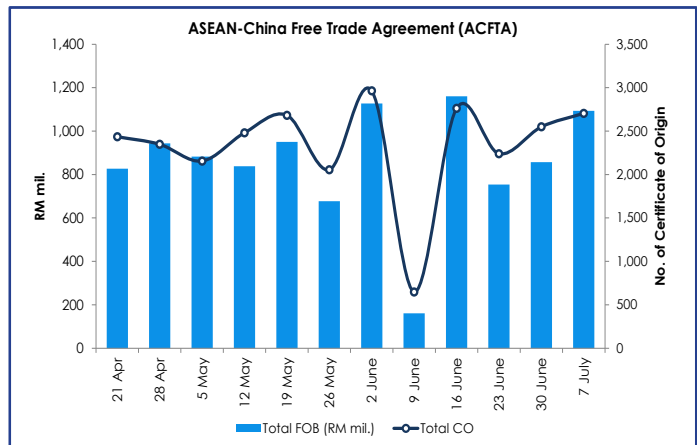
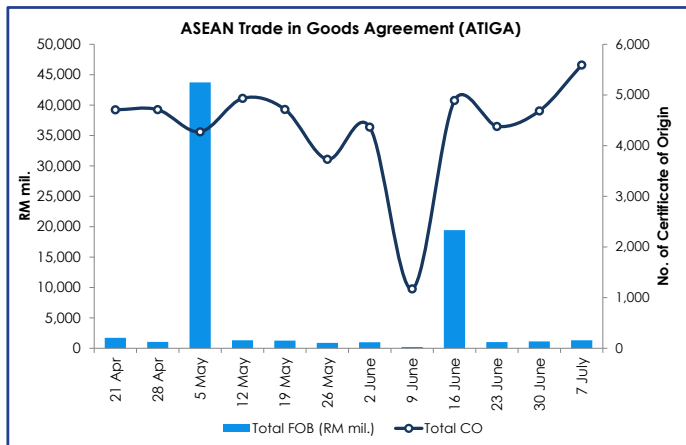
The forum was formed in 1989 as an informal dialogue among government officials from 12 economies. Since then, its membership and scope has expanded.

Today, APEC members make up a big part of the world. The member economies are home to around 2.9 billion people and represent one of the most valuable economic regions. In 2017, APEC accounted for more than half of GDP and half of the world trade.



APEC's 21 Member Economies are the United States; Australia; Brunei Darussalam; Canada; Chile; China; Hong Kong, China; Indonesia; Japan; Malaysia; Mexico; New Zealand; Papua New Guinea; Peru; The Philippines; Russia; Singapore; Republic of Korea; Chinese Taipei; Thailand; and Viet Nam.

Number and Value of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)

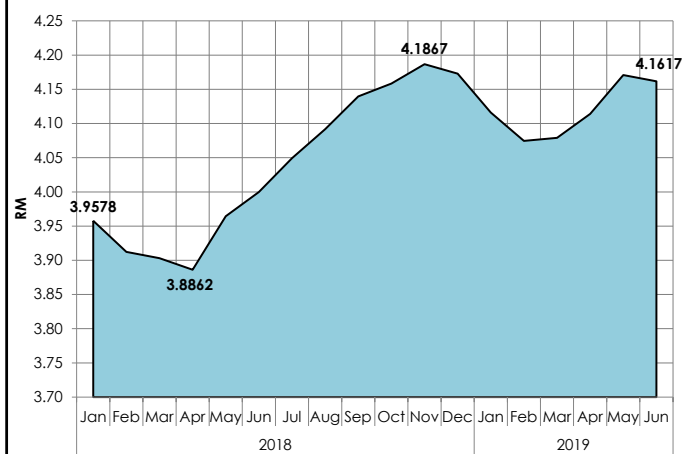

Illegal production

Illegal production is the production of goods or services whose sale, distribution or possession is forbidden by law; and production activities which are usually legal but which become illegal when carried out by unauthorised producers. The scope of illegal production varies depending on the laws in place in individual countries (e.g. prostitution is legal in some countries but illegal in others).

Import duties

Description 1

Import duties consist of customs duties, or other import charges, which are payable on goods of a particular type when they enter the economic territory.

Description 2

The definitive measure comes from the annual report of the Accountant General and these are used for the annual estimates. The Customs Department provides monthly accounts from their administrative records and these are used for the most recent year estimates. The current price import duties are deflated by the relevant PPI to arrive at constant price import duties.

Imports

Goods are regarded as imports when they are brought into the country either directly or into bonded warehouses, irrespective of whether such goods are for consumption, to be processed, use in manufacturing or subsequent re-exports to other countries.

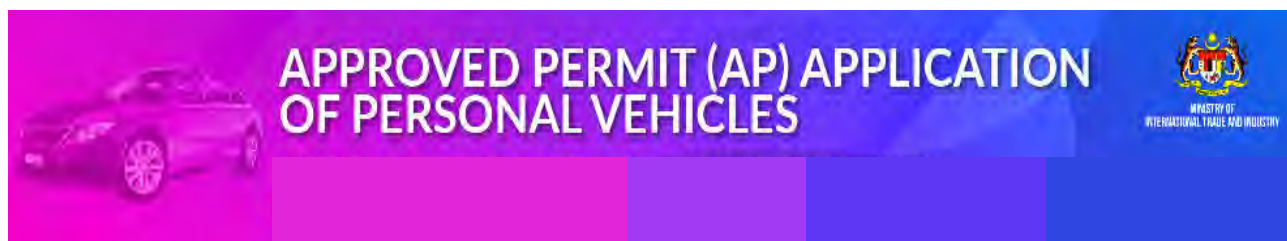
