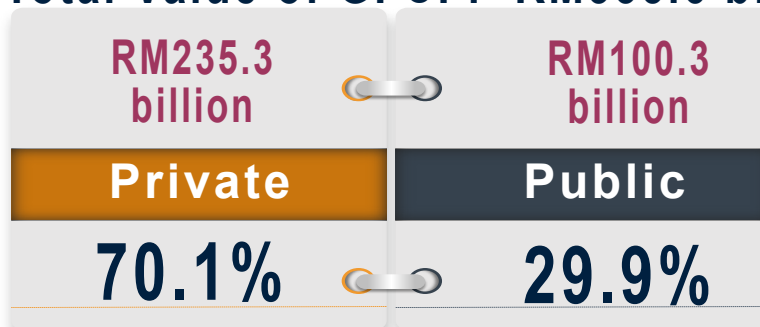

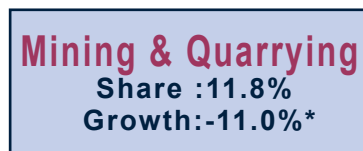
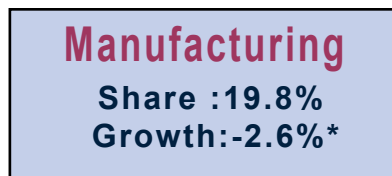
GFCF by Sector, 2018

GFCF by kind of economic activity, 2018



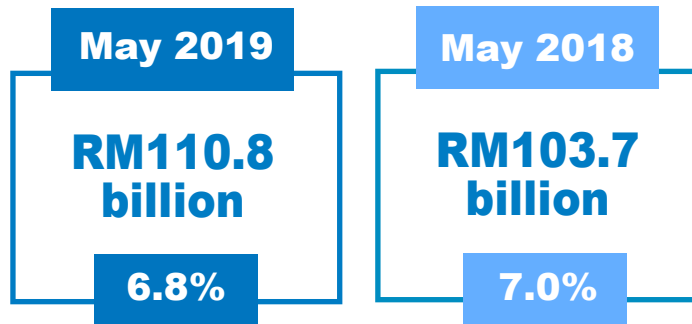

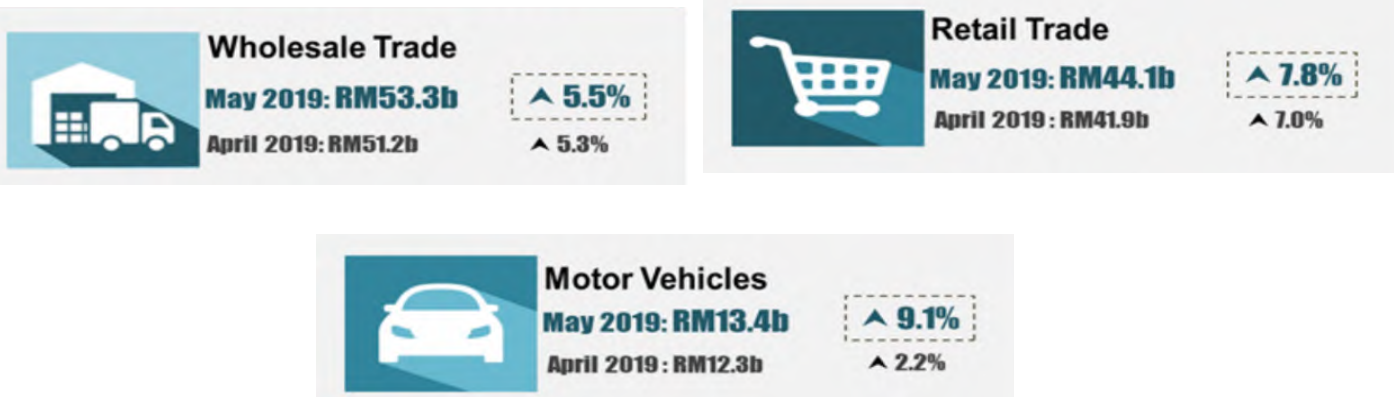

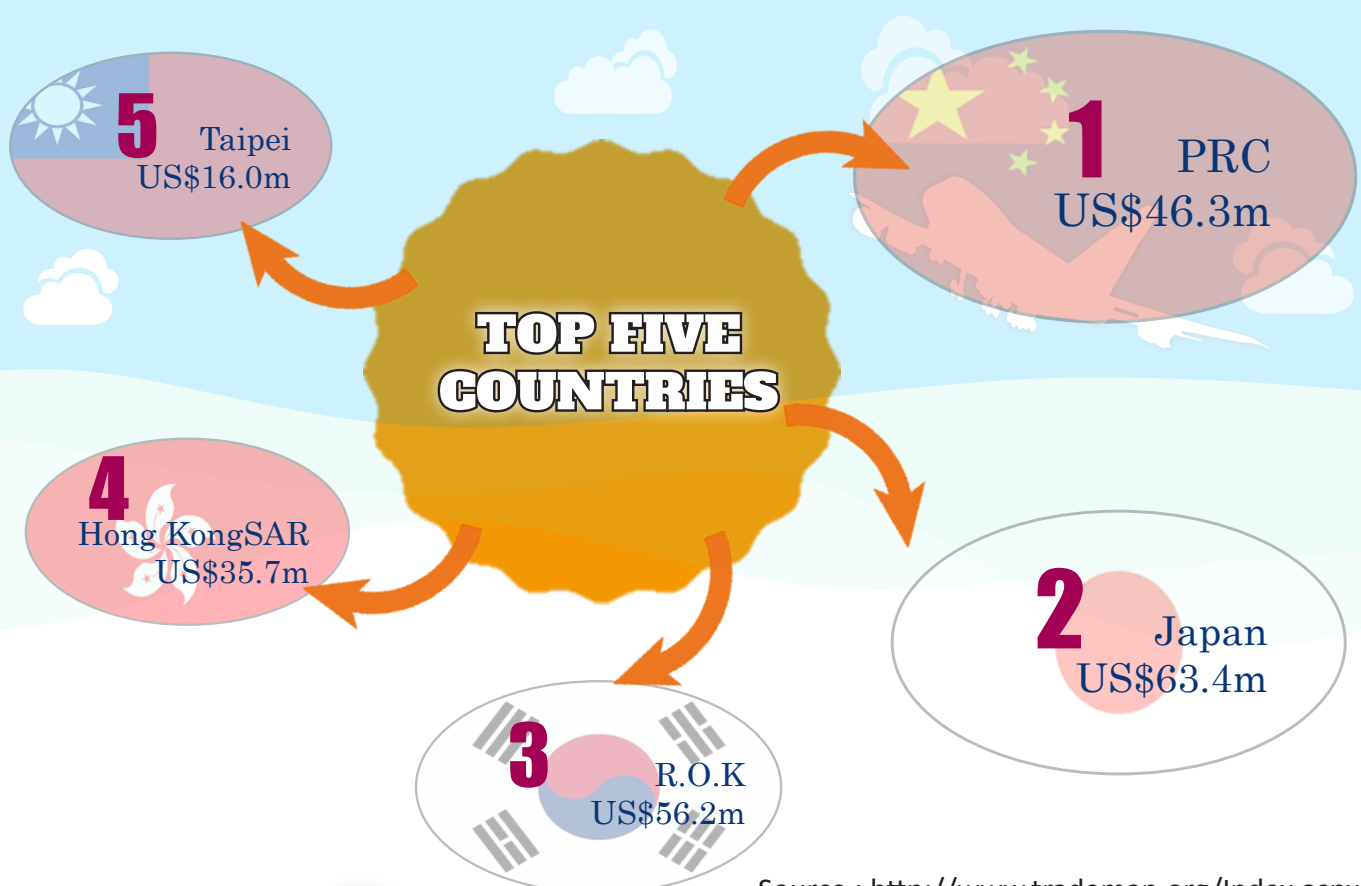

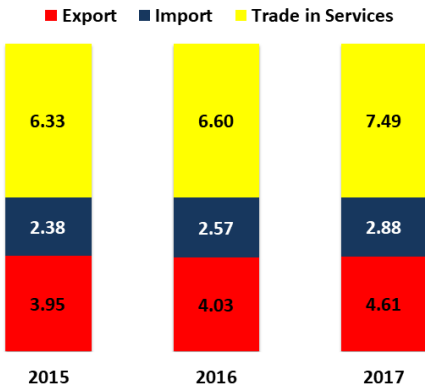

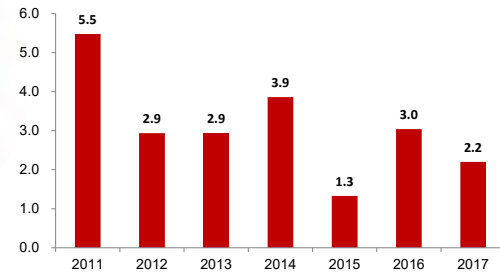

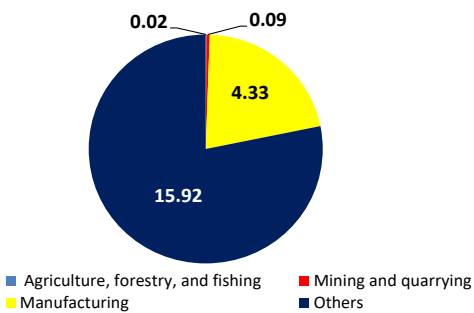
CAMBODIA Inflation Rate

Net FDI Inflows by Sector, 2017 (US\$ million)



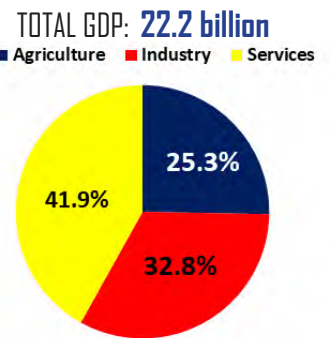

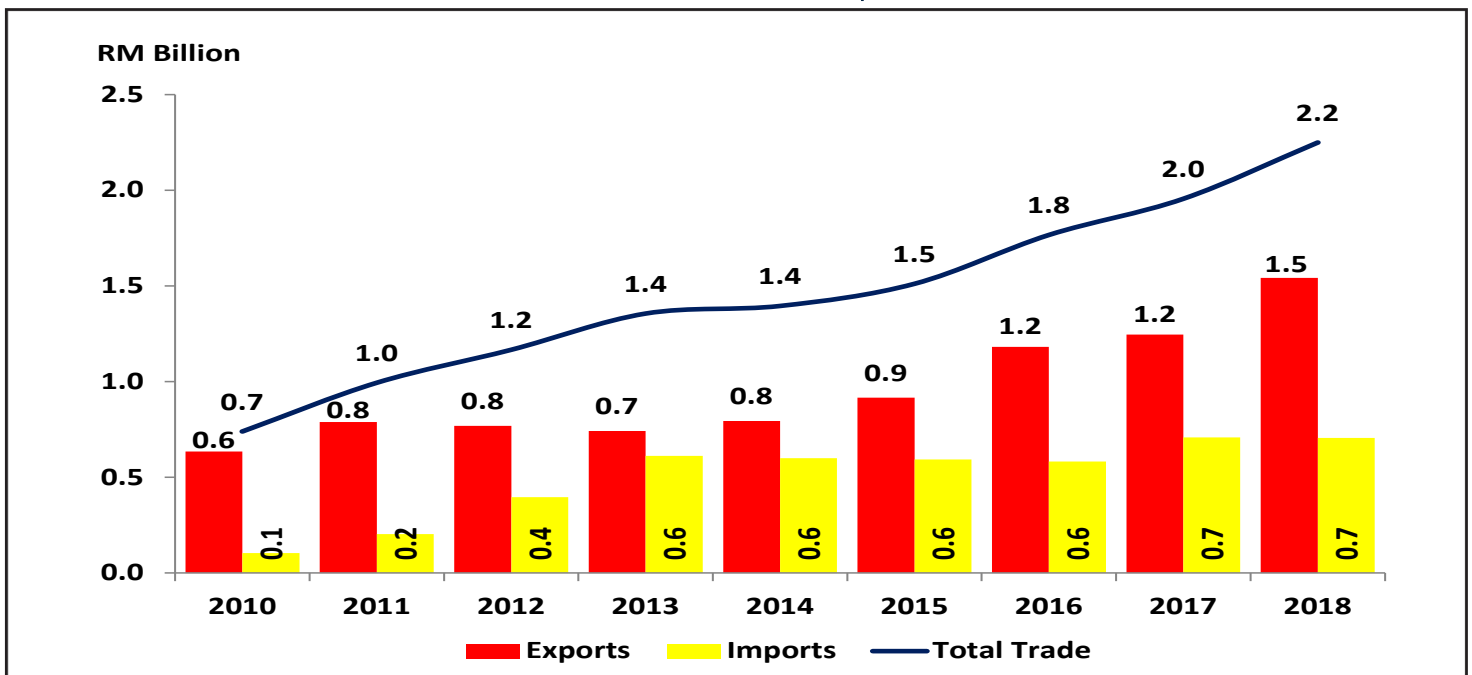
GDP by Economic Sector, 2017 (%)

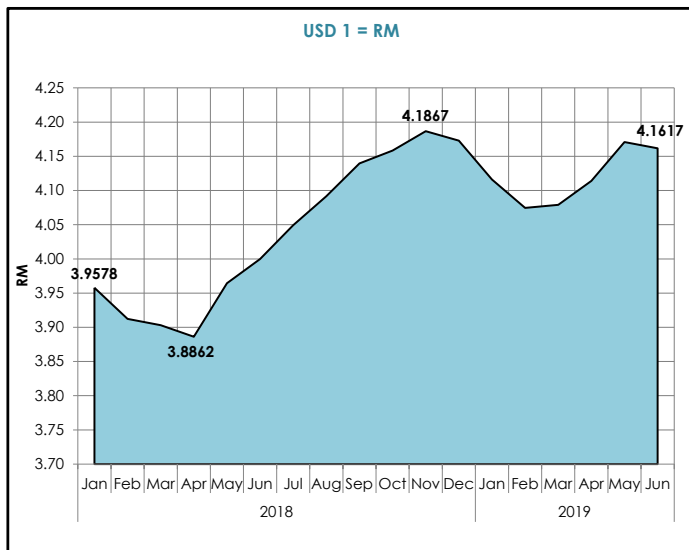
Number and Value of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)



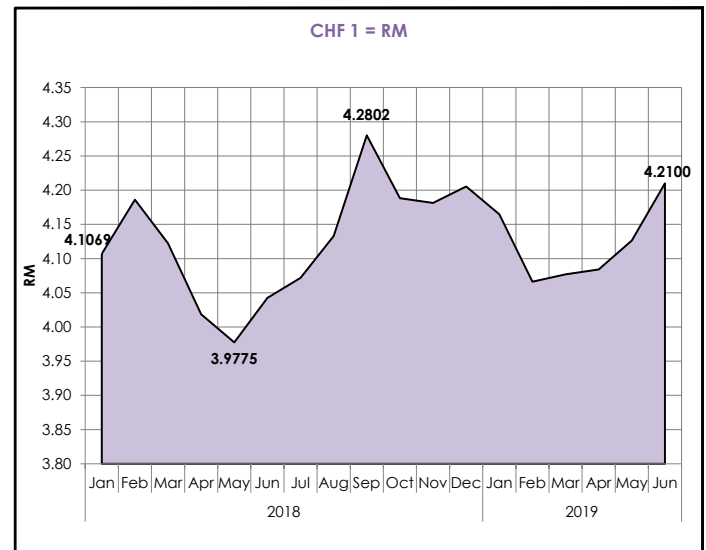

Malaysian Ringgit Exchange Rate with Selected Countries, January 2018 - June 2019

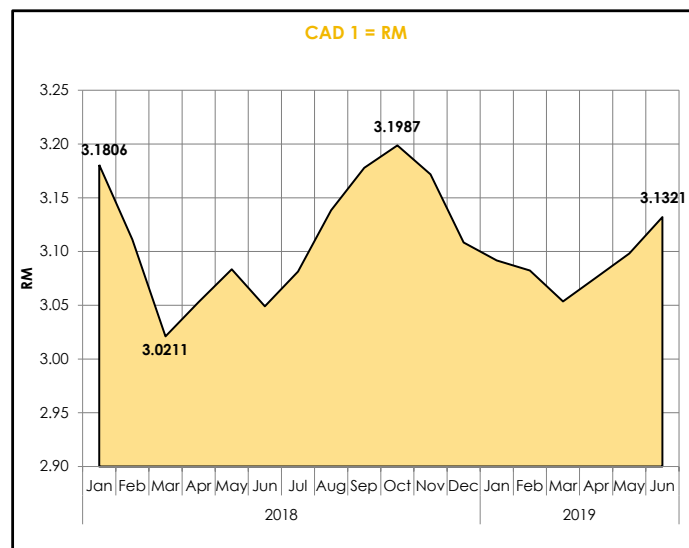
