Kerajaan pertimbang tiga cadangan cara penganjuran

KUALA LUMPUR: Kerajaan pada ketika ini sedang mempertimbang beberapa pilihan bagi penganjuran Kerjasama Ekonomi Asia Pasifik (APEC) 2020 susulan penularan pandemik COVID-19.

Menteri Kanan Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri (MITI), Datuk Seri Mohamed Azmin Ali berkata terdapat tiga kemungkinan berkenaan cara penganjuran yang sedang dipertimbang Kerajaan.

Ujarnya, ia termasuk mengadakan sidang tersebut secara maya atau hibrid iaitu membenarkan delegasi dari negara zon hijau ke Malaysia atau menangguhkan sidang tersebut pada 2023.

"Kerajaan sedang menimbang beberapa pilihan. Sama ada kita buat virtual sepenuhnya tetapi ada juga cabaran yang perlu dihadapi kerana kita ada lapan zon masa di antara anggota ekonomi APEC.

"Kita telah berjaya diperingkat pegawai dan saya percaya perkara ini boleh dipertimbangkan.

"Yang kedua, menggunakan hibrid. Mungkin sebahagian boleh hadir untuk negara-negara yang telah diisyiharkan zon hijau dan negara-negara yang belum lagi, mungkin

mereka terpaksa buat secara virtual.

"Kemungkinan ketiga, kita mungkin menimbang untuk ambil slot tahun 2023 yang belum ada penganjur pada tahun berkenaan," katanya di Dewan Rakyat hari ini.

Beliau berkata demikian sebagai menjawab soalan tambahan Datuk Ignatius Darell Leiking (Warisan-Penampang) yang ingin mengetahui langkah seterusnya kerajaan dalam penganjuran APEC tahun ini susulan penularan pandemik COVID-19.

Menjawab soalan asal, Azmin berkata dalam situasi ekonomi semasa, adalah penting bagi Malaysia memamerkan komitmen bagi memimpin rantau Asia-Pasifik dalam meningkatkan integrasi ekonomi serantau, khususnya dalam memudah cara aktiviti perdagangan dan pelaburan.

"Penganjuran APEC 2020 merupakan satu platform strategik bagi Malaysia untuk membuktikan keupayaan dan kemampuan negara dalam memacu agenda pendigitalan dan teknologi tinggi. Pendekatan ini adalah bertepatan dengan usaha untuk meningkatkan daya saing negara di peringkat serantau dan global," katanya.










HOUSEHOLD DISTRIBUTION BY INCOME

INCOME SHARE BY DECILE






MEAN MONTHLY HOUSEHOLD CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

In 2019, the mean monthly household consumption expenditure rose 3.9 per cent per annum in tandem with the moderate growth of mean monthly household income at 4.2 per cent for the period 2016 to 2019. In terms of value, the mean monthly household expenditure increased from RM4,033 in 2016 to RM4,534 in 2019. Meanwhile, the median monthly household expenditure registered RM3,654 in 2019 compared to RM3,314 in 2016.

Household Consumption Expenditure by Type of Goods

In 2019, the percentage of expenditure for services component was 52.1 per cent which was higher than the total expenditure on goods at 47.9 per cent. In terms of growth, the services component increased by 4.5 per cent as compared to the goods component in between the period 2016 to 2019.



Household Consumption Expenditure by Main Groups

In 2019, the group housing, water, electricity, gas & other fuels (23.6%); Food & non-alcoholic beverages (17.3%); and Transport (13.5%) remained the major components of expenditure. However, three of these groups showed decreases in the composition of consumption expenditures namely Food & non-alcoholic beverages (-0.7 percentage points); Housing, water, electricity, gas & other fuels (-0.4 percentage points); and Transport (-0.2 percentage points).

Global Economic Effects of COVID-19

Updated July 9, 2020

ECONOMIC FORECASTS : Global Growth

The International Monetary Fund (IMF), the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), and The World Bank all revised their forecasts downward between late 2019 and mid-2020, reflecting the rapidly deteriorating state of the global economy and a marked decline in projected rates of growth. Between October 2019 and June 2020, for instance, the IMF lowered its global economic growth forecast from a positive 3.4% to a negative 4.9%. Similarly, the OECD lowered its forecast from 2.9% in November 2019 to -6.0% to -7.6% in June 2020, depending on a single or double wave of infections. Between January 2019 and June 2020, the World Bank also lowered its forecast of global growth from 2.9% to a negative 5.2%. In most forecasts, advanced economies are projected to experience the steepest declines in economic growth from 2019 to mid-June 2020.

GLOBAL TRADE

According to a June 23 forecast update, the World Trade Organization (WTO) estimated that global trade volumes could fall by 18.5% in 2020 and then recover in 2021. This forecast reflects a downward revision from the WTO's April 8, 2020, more optimistic forecast that global trade volumes could decline between 13% and 32% in 2020 as a result of the economic impact of COVID-19.

WTO April Forecast: Merchandise Trade Volume and Real GDP 2018-2021




Number and Value of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)



Regional FTA Number and Value of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)





Malaysian Ringgit Exchange Rate with Selected Countries, January 2019 - June 2020


