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## KENYATAAN MEDIA YAB PERDANA MENTERI

Berdasarkan trend kes-kes harian COVID-19 yang semakin meningkat, Kerajaan telah memutuskan untuk mengambil langkah-langkah yang lebih tegas dan ketat bagi mengekang penularan wabak COVID-19 dalam masyarakat dan menghalang kenaikan kes secara mendadak.

Dengan jumlah kes harian melebihi 4,000 kes dan 37,396 kes aktif dengan 1,700 kes kematian dilaporkan setakat 10 Mei 2021, Malaysia sedang berhadapan dengan gelombang ketiga COVID-19 yang boleh mencetuskan suatu krisis nasional.

Kewujudan varian-varian baharu dengan kadar jangkitan yang lebih tinggi, kekangan ke atas kapasiti sistem kesihatan awam yang semakin meruncing dan kelemahan pematuhan SOP dalam kalangan sebahagian anggota masyarakat menuntut Kerajaan untuk mengambil tindakan yang lebih drastik bagi mengelakkan negara terjerumus ke dalam malapetaka kesihatan yang lebih parah.

Data dan sains terus menunjukkan bahawa aktiviti-aktiviti perhimpunan yang menyukarkan penjarakan sosial dan keberadaan orang ramai dalam ruang yang sesak menjadi punca utama penularan COVID-19. Rantaian jangkitan COVID-19 hanya dapat diputuskan dengan menggalakkan orang ramai duduk di rumah menerusi kawalan pergerakan yang lebih ketat.

Sehubungan itu, Sidang Khas Majlis Keselamatan Negara Mengenai Pengurusan COVID-19 yang saya pengerusikan hari ini telah membuat keputusan untuk melaksanakan Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan di SELURUH NEGARA seperti berikut:

1. Larangan rentas daerah dan rentas negeri kecuali untuk tujuan kecemasan, kesihatan, bekerja, ekonomi, temu janji vaksinasi dan pasangan jarak jauh;
2. Melarang SEMUA bentuk perhimpunan sosial termasuk kenduri kendara, majlis perkahwinan dan pertunangan, majlis doa selamat dan tahlil, majlis makan malam, majlis sambutan hari jadi sertamajlis-majlis rasmi kerajaan dan swasta. Sebarang bentuk seminar, persidangan dan mesyuarat secara bersemuka adalah tidak dibenarkan. Majlis akad nikah adalah dibenarkan dengan jumlah kehadiran dan SOP yang ditentukan oleh pihak berkuasa agama Islam negeri bagi orang Islam dan Jabatan Pendaftaran Negara bagi orang bukan Islam;
3. Melarang semua aktiviti sukan dan rekreasi kecuali sukan dan rekreasi individu di kawasan terbuka seperti jogging, berbasikal dan senaman dengan mengamalkan penjarakan fizikal;
4. Semua institusi pendidikan ditutup. Pengecualian diberikan kepada pelajar-pelajar yang akan menduduki peperiksaan antarabangsa. Pusat Asuhan Kanak-kanak, tabika, taska dan tadika dibenarkan beroperasi mengikut SOP yang ditetapkan bagi membantu urusan kerja ibu bapa atau penjaga;

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5. Bilangan orang di dalam kenderaan persendirian, teksi dan e-hailing dihadkan kepada TIGA ORANG SAHAJA termasuk pemandu. Bilangan orang yang dibenarkan di dalam kenderaan membawa barang serta rantaian aktiviti ekonomi/industri adalah bergantung kepada jumlah yang dibenarkan dalam lesen pendaftaran kenderaan perdagangan. Bilangan orang yang dibenarkan di dalam pengangkutan awam mestilah mematuhi penjarakan fizikal dan mematuhi SOP yang telah ditetapkan.
6. Dine-in di restoran dan kedai makan adalah TIDAK DIBENARKAN. Penjualan makanan secara pandu lalu dan take-away adalah dibenarkan;
7. Majikan DIWAJIBKAN melaksanakan dasar Bekerja Dari Rumah (BDR) dengan kehadiran tidak lebih 30 peratus kakitangan pengurusan pada setiap masa. BDR sektor awam ditentukan oleh garis panduan yang dikeluarkan oleh Ketua Setiausaha Negara dari semasa ke semasa; dan
8. Ziarah rumah ke rumah dan ziarah kubur semasa sambutan Hari Raya Aidilfitri adalah TIDAK DIBENARKAN.
9. Solat sunat Aidilfitri di masjid dan surau dibenarkan dengan kehadiran jemaah tidak melebihi 50 orang bagi masjid dan surau yang boleh memuatkan lebih 1,000 jemaah dan 20 orang bagi masjid dan surau yang boleh memuatkan kurang daripada 1,000 jemaah. Had bilangan jemaah yang sama terpakai bagi solat fardu lima waktu dan solat Jumaat.
10. Operasi Rumah Ibadah Bukan Islam juga akan diperketatkan. SOP bagi Rumah Ibadah Bukan Islam ditetapkan oleh Kementerian Perpaduan;
11. Langkah-langkah khusus yang sedang dilaksanakan di Sabah, Sarawak dan Wilayah Persekutuan Labuan diteruskan.

Tarikh kuat kuasa larangan rentas daerah dan negeri serta larangan aktiviti sosial, sukan dan pendidikan adalah bermula pada 10 Mei hingga 6 Jun 2021 seperti yang telah diumumkan oleh YB Menteri Kanan Pertahanan pada 8 Mei 2021.

Tarikh kuat kuasa bagi larangan-larangan dan arahan-arahan lain bermula pada 12 Mei hingga 7 Jun 2021.

Sepanjang tempoh ini, semua SEKTOR EKONOMI DIBENARKAN untuk beroperasi.

SOP terperinci bagi semua larangan dan arahan yang terkandung dalam Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan ini akan diumumkan oleh Majlis Keselamatan Negara.

Kerajaan akan terus menggunakan sistem HIDE untuk memantau premis dan kawasan hotspot COVID-19 serta mengambil tindakan susulan seperti yang telah diputuskan.

Saya berharap semua rakyat terus berdisiplin dan mematuhi SOP bagi memutuskan rantaian jangkitan COVID-19. Yang terbaik ialah duduk di rumah atau stay at home untuk bersama-sama melandaikan lengkuk jangkitan COVID-19.

Kita telah berjaya melandaikan lengkuk jangkitan COVID-19 dalam gelombang pertama dan kedua penularan wabak ini. Saya ingin mengingatkan gelombang

ketiga yang sedang kita hadapi ini lebih ganas dan kritikal. Kita masih belum menang.

Hadapilah gelombang ketiga ini dengan penuh disiplin. Hanya diri kita yang boleh jaga nyawa kita sendiri selain ketentuan llahi. Duduklah di rumah jika tiada perkara penting yang perlu diurus.

Wabak ini menjadi lemah dan tewas jika kita mengamalkan disiplin kendiri yang tinggi. Disiplin kendiri ini bukanlah sukar untuk dilaksanakan. Elakkan tempat yang sesak, jaga penjarakan fizikal, sentiasa memakai pelitup muka di tempat awam dan bersihkan tangan anda pada setiap masa di samping mengamalkan kebersihan kendiri yang baik.

Insya-Allah, dengan pertolongan Allah s.w.t. kita akan berjaya menewaskan virus COVID-19.




## GDP, Q1 2021

Malaysia's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the first quarter of 2021 registered a marginal decrease of 0.5 per cent as against a decline of 3.4 per cent in the previous quarter. For quarter-on-quarter seasonally adjusted, GDP posted positive growth of 2.7 per cent (Q4 2020: -1.5%).

On the supply side, the improvement of growth was supported by the expansion in the Manufacturing sector and the rebound of Agriculture sector, while the Services sector recorded a smaller contraction.

On the demand side, the better performance was led by Exports of goods and services, Private final consumption expenditure and Gross fixed capital formation.

## SERVICES SECTOR STATISTICS, Q1 2021

Total revenue of Services sector in first quarter 2021 recorded RM428.5 billion, decreased -1.7 per cent as compared to the fourth quarter 2020. The growth was contributed by Wholesale & Retail Trade, Food & Beverages and Accommodation segment (-RM4.6 billion; -1.3%). Meanwhile, total revenue on annual comparison contracted by -2.1 per cent compared to -5.1 per cent in the previous quarter.



# DISTRIBUTIVE TRADE STATISTICS, Q1 2021

Sales value for Wholesale & Retail Trade sub-sector recorded RM332.6 billion for the first quarter of 2021 with a growth of -1.1 per cent quarter-on-quarter. The negative growth was due to Motor Vehicles activity which decreased RM2.0 billion (-5.2%). Retail Trade and Wholesale Trade activities registered a growth of -0.7 per cent (-RM0.9 billion) and -0.5 per cent (-RM0.7 billion) respectively. However, year-on-year comparison, this sub-sector expanded 1.7 per cent.

## SERVICES PRODUCER PRICE INDEX, Q1 2021

The Services Producer Price Index (SPPI) for the first quarter of 2021 increased 0.4 per cent to 110.2 as compared to 109.8 in the same quarter of the preceding year. The main sub-sectors that showed an increase were Accommodation and Food & Beverage Service Activities (1.4%), Real Estate Activities (1.4%), Health (1.3%), Education (0.8%) and Transportation (0.1%). However, the index for Arts, Entertainment & Recreation and Information & Communication decreased by 1.2 per cent and 0.1 per cent respectively. Index for Professional remained unchanged.

## CONSTRUCTION STATISTICS, Q1 2021


The value of construction work done in the first quarter 2021 grew -10.5 per cent (Q4 2020: -14.2%) year-on-year basis, amounting to RM31.4 billion (Q4 2020: RM31.7 billion). A quarter on quarter comparison also showed that the value of construction work done contracted by 1.1 per cent from the previous quarter. The Special trades activities sub-sector registered a growth at 38.0 per cent in the first quarter 2021 as compared to the same quarter last year. Meanwhile, the other three sub-sectors, namely Residential buildings, Non-residential buildings and Civil engineering each showed a growth of -4.2 per cent, -5.3 per cent and -22.3 per cent respectively, as compared with the same quarter 2020.






## MALAYSIA'S TOP FIVE EXPORT DESTINATION





## Number of PCO as at 2 May 2021 Weekly / Monthly/ Annually



# Regional FTA Number of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)






## Number of Preferential Certificates of Origin (PCOs)

Cross-district and state movement **from and to MCO areas** for work purposes is allowed with a letter of permission approved by the relevant Ministry or Agency together with the employee's pass / employer's support letter.

## CAN COMPANIES OPERATE?

Companies can operate according to the SOPs set by the NSC. For **sectors under MITI and KPDNHEP**, their operations are supported by **MITI's approval letter** while for the other sectors, the approval comes from their respective ministries.

## WHAT'S THE STAFF CAPACITY?

**30% capacity for management group** in the MCO areas only. There's no restrictions for non-management employees to attend work at the premise.

## CAN I USE BACKDATED CIMS LETTER?

**Yes**, as long as the letter is authentic. However, MITI recommends that you download a new letter to avoid any issues with the authorities.

## WHAT SECTORS CAN OPERATE?

All economic sectors can operate, except for activities listed under the NSC's negative list.

## CAN I WORK FROM HOME (WFH)?

Operations and support staff can attend work at the office and if they want to WFH, it needs to be at the discretion of the employer.


