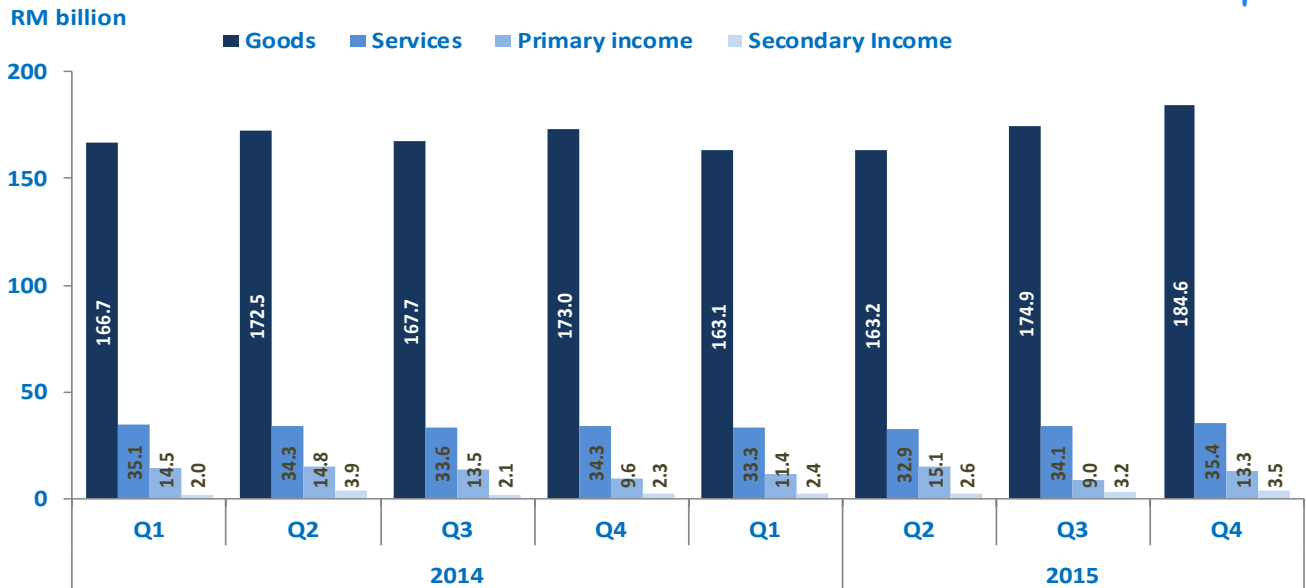

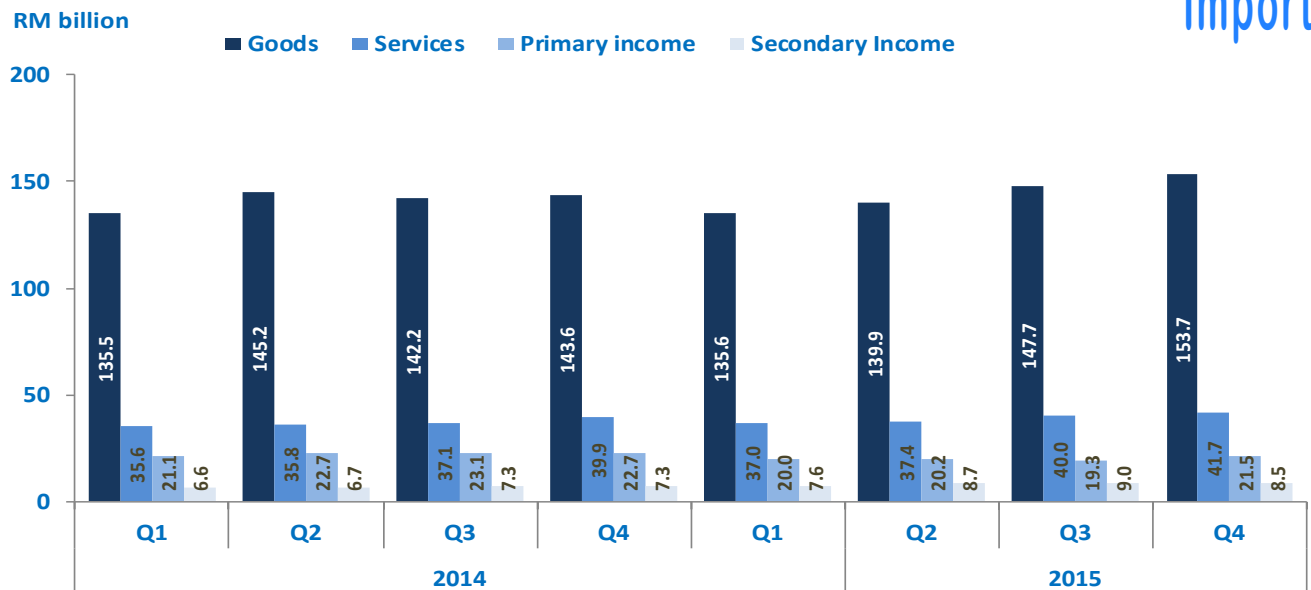

Current Account Components in Balance of Payments (BOP), Q1 2014 - Q4 2015

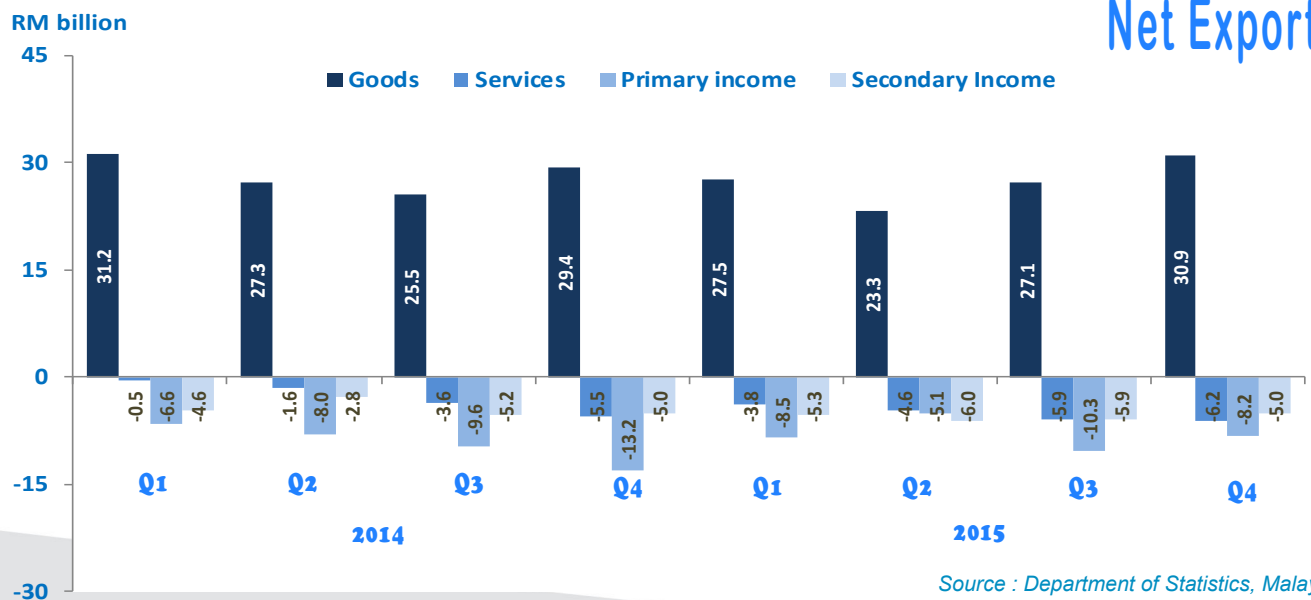

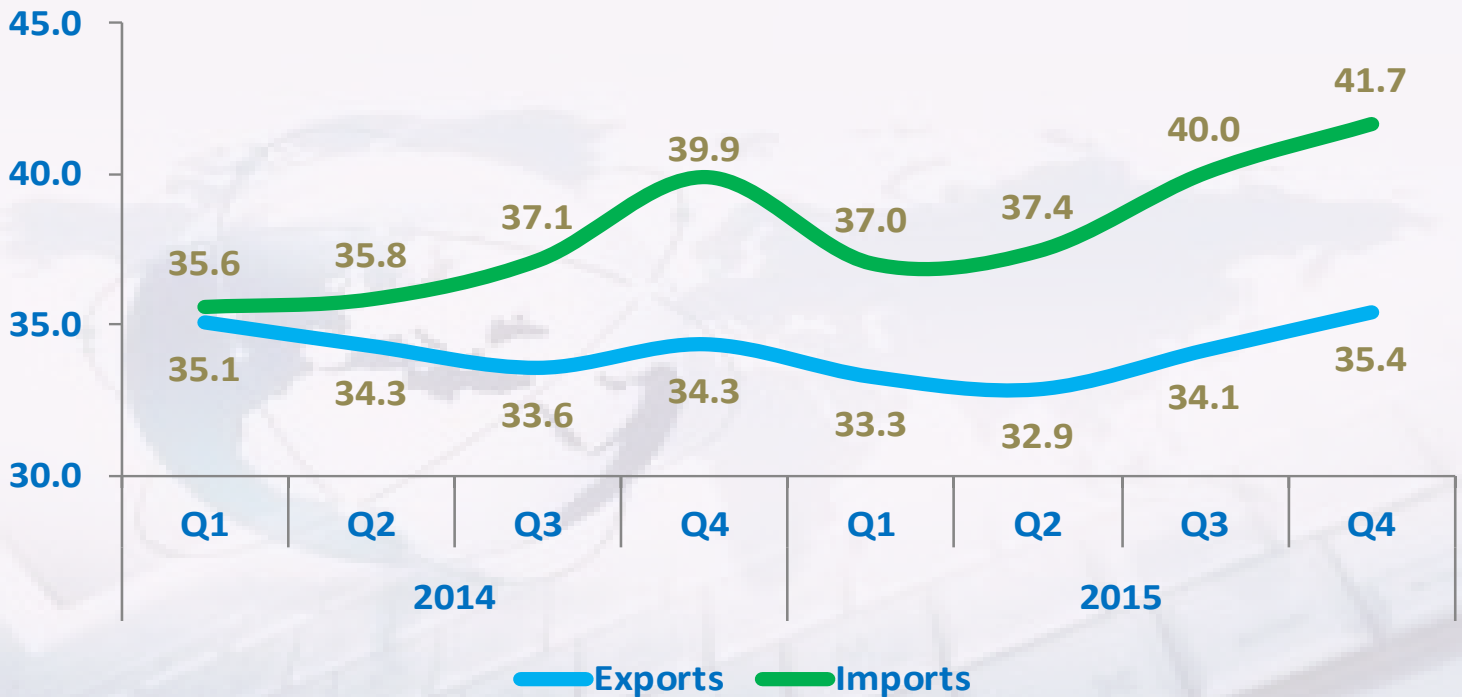

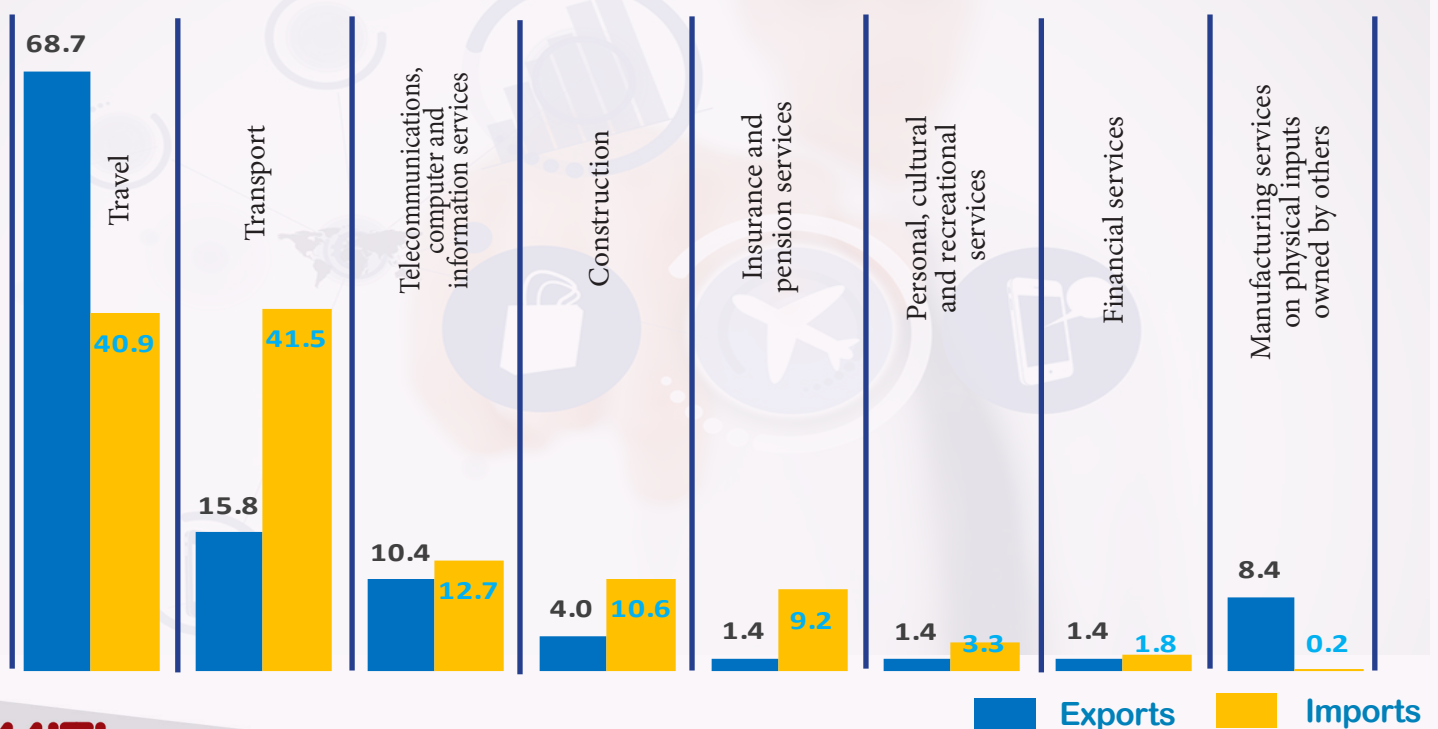
Trade in Services, Q1 2014 - Q4 2015

KERJASAMA YANG DICADANGKAN DALAM TPPA

KASTAM

Kerjasama Kastam memberi peluang kepada ahli TPPA untuk berkongsi maklumat antara satu sama lain berhubung dengan pengimportan atau pengeksporan dagangan, dan larangan ke atas pengimportan atau pengeksporan. TPPA juga menetapkan pemakaian prosedur Kastam yang mudah untuk pelepasan barangan bagi tujuan fasilitasi perdagangan seperti pelepasan barangan dalam tempoh tidak lebih dari yang ditetapkan, penghantaran maklumat secara elektronik yang lebih awal sebelum ketibaan barangan serta barangan boleh dilepaskan semasa ketibaan tanpa pemindahan ke gudang.

TEKSTIL

Bab Tekstil menggariskan bentuk kerjasama di antara negara-negara ahli TPPA bagi tujuan penguatkuasaan atau membantu dalam menguatkuasakan peraturan-peraturan berkenaan kesalahan Kastam bagi perdagangan produk tekstil dan pakaian. Kerjasama ini melibatkan perkongsian maklumat mengenai kesalahan Kastam dan juga pengesahan mengenai tuntutan kelayakan keutamaan di bawah TPPA.

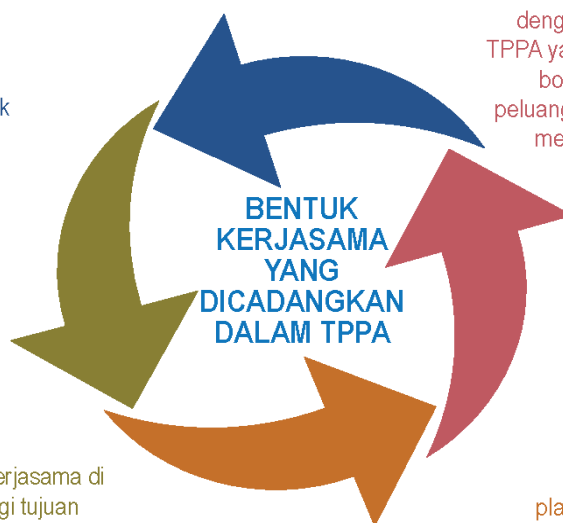

PKS

Syarikat-syarikat PKS Malaysia berpeluang menjalankan kerjasama serta berkongsi pangkalan data (*database*) dengan PKS dari negara-negara ahli TPPA yang lain. Maklumat-maklumat ini boleh digunakan untuk meluaskan peluang untuk memasar, menjual serta menjalankan penyelidikan pasaran sebelum PKS menceburi pasaran TPPA.

AKSES PASARAN

Negara-negara ahli TPPA bersetuju membentuk kumpulan kerja bagi produk bioteknologi moden di bawah Jawatankuasa Perdagangan Pertanian untuk pertukaran maklumat dan kerjasama. Ini akan menjadi platform bagi pertukaran maklumat undang-undang tempatan sedia ada dan yang dicadangkan, serta peraturan dan polisi berkaitan perdagangan produk bioteknologi moden. Kumpulan kerja ini juga akan meningkatkan kerjasama bagi perkara-perkara kepentingan bersama dalam perdagangan produk bioteknologi.

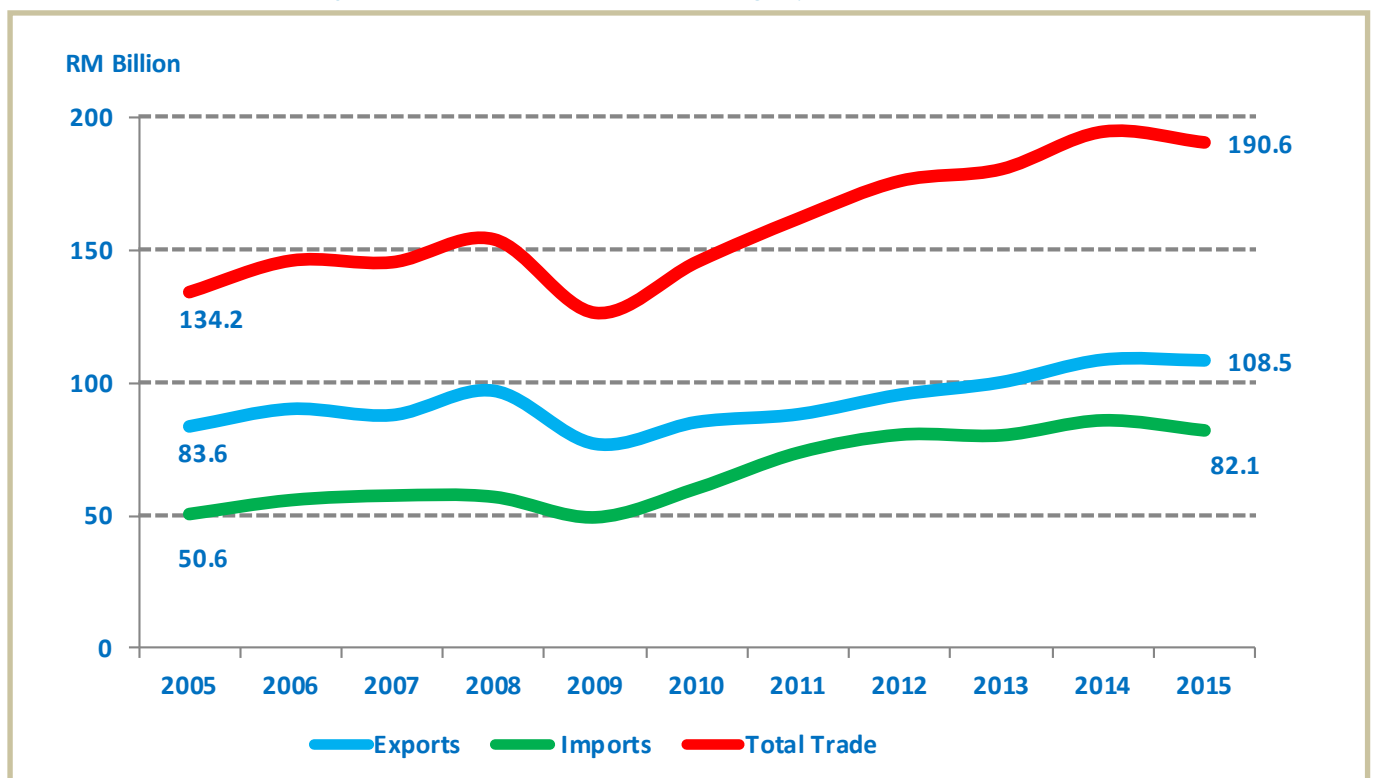

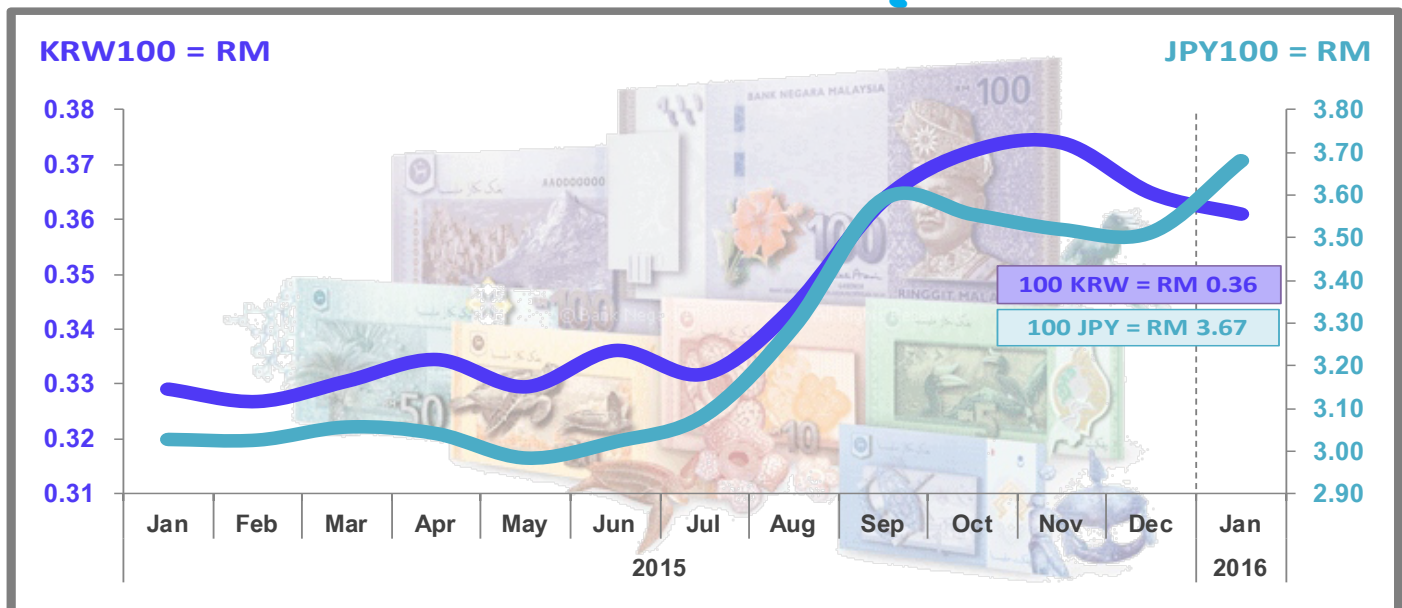

Value of Preferential Certificates of Origin



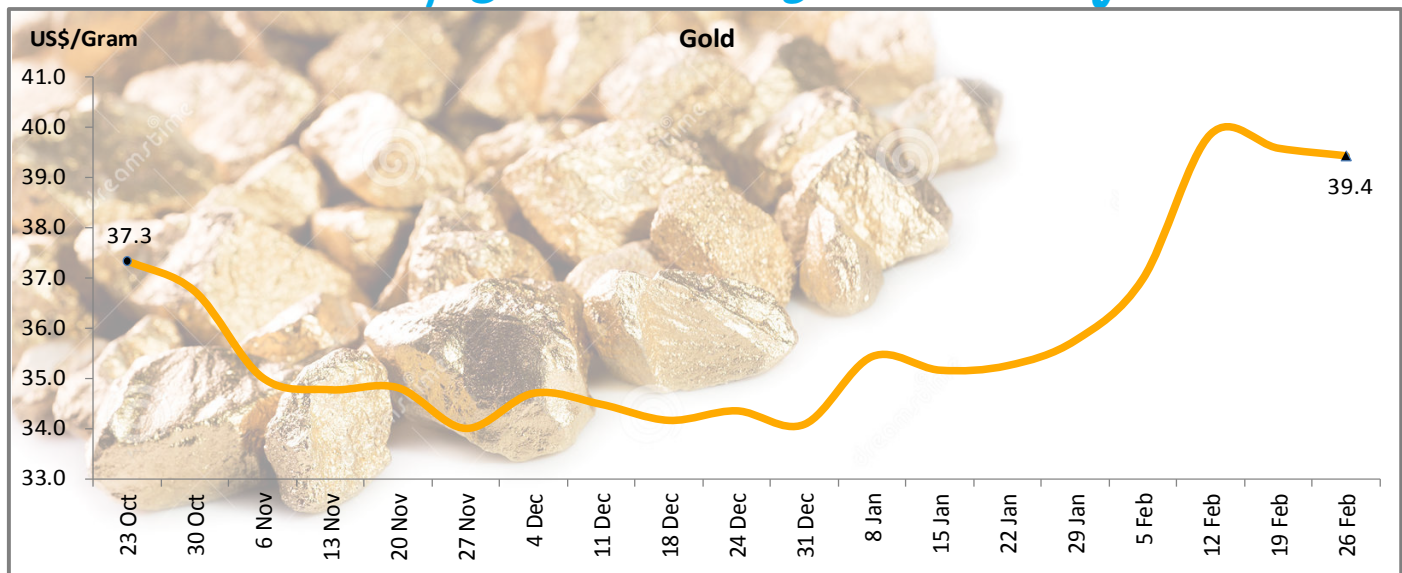

Malaysian Ringgit Exchange Rate with South Korean Won and Japanese Yen



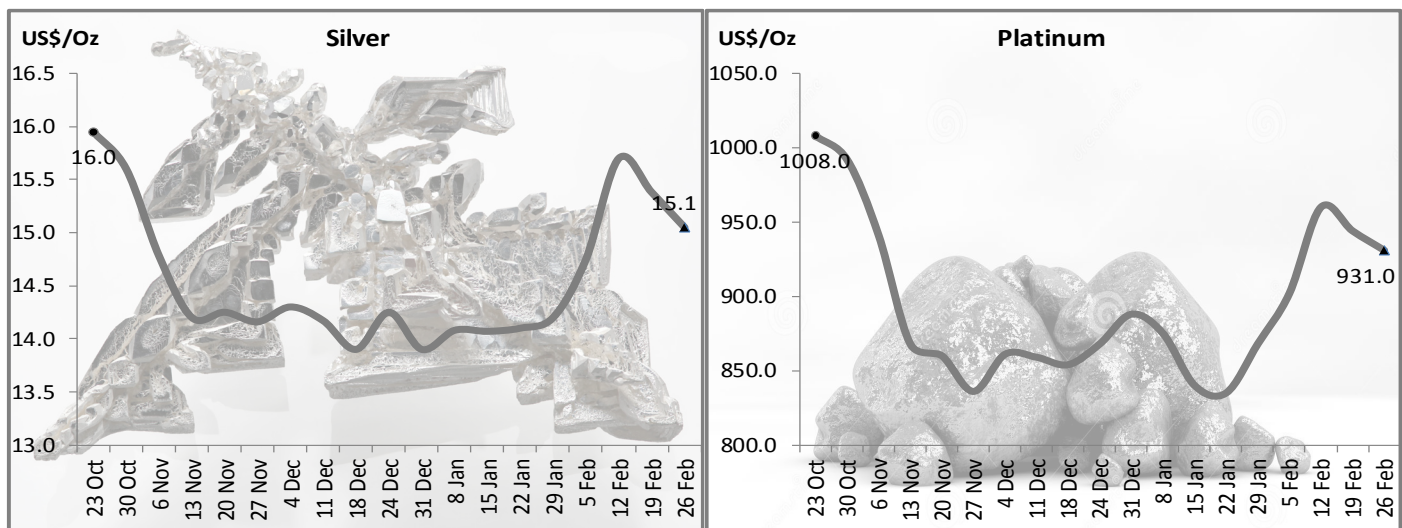

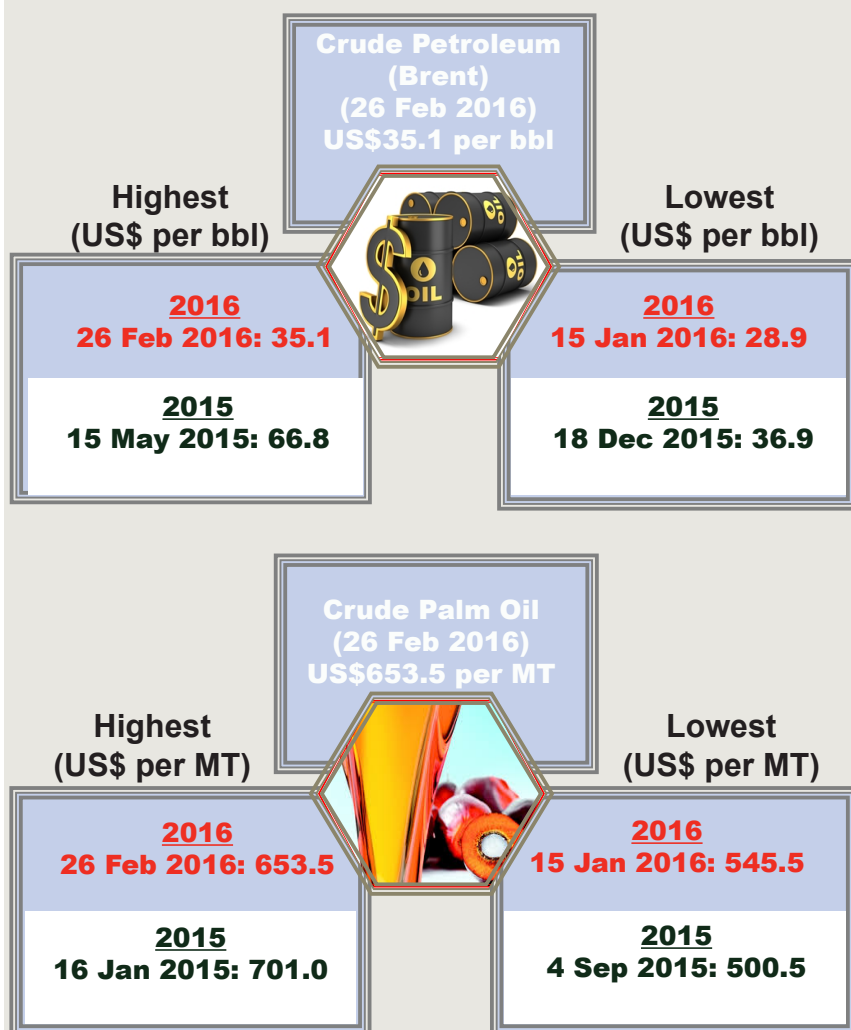

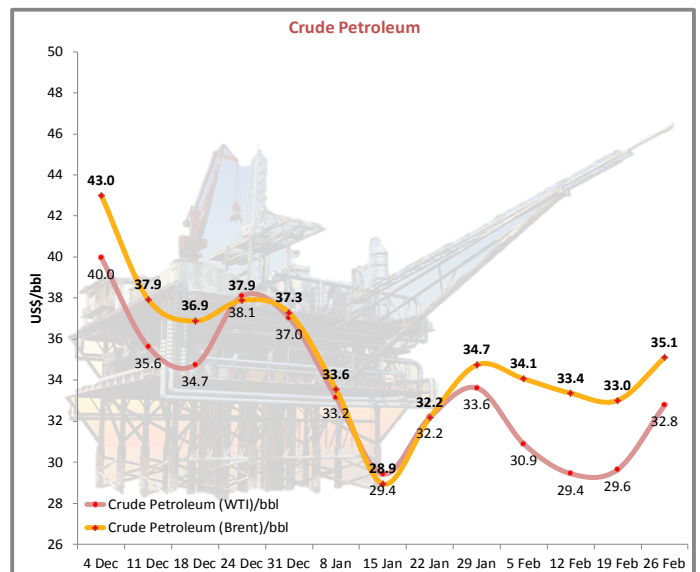
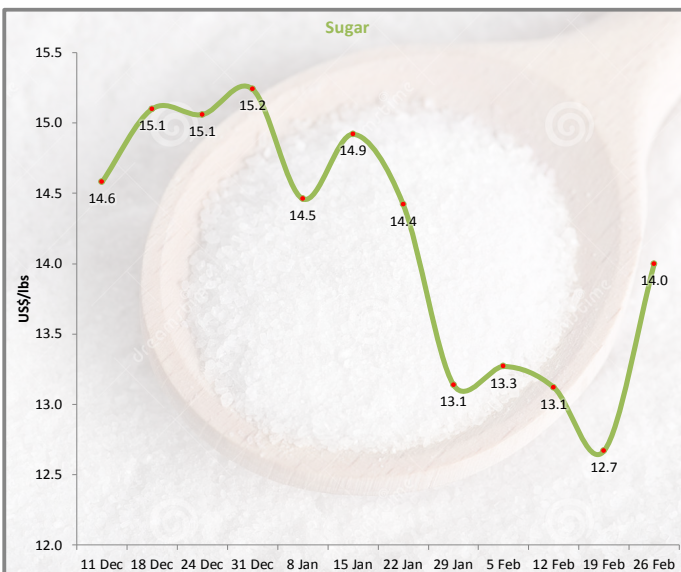
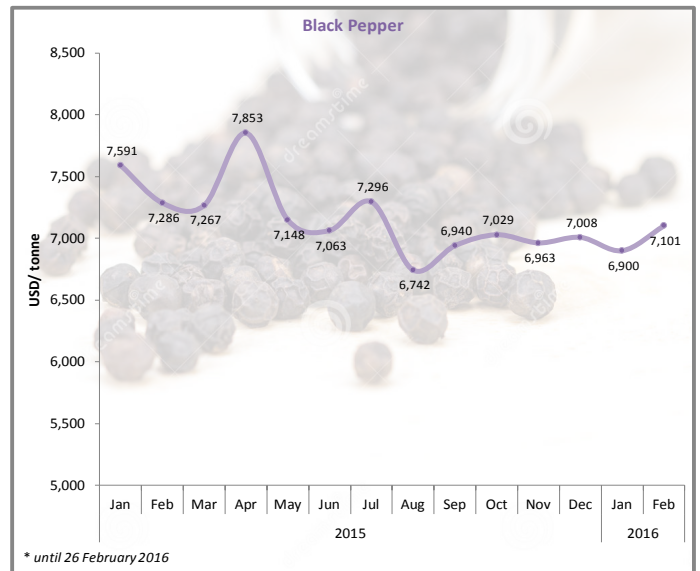
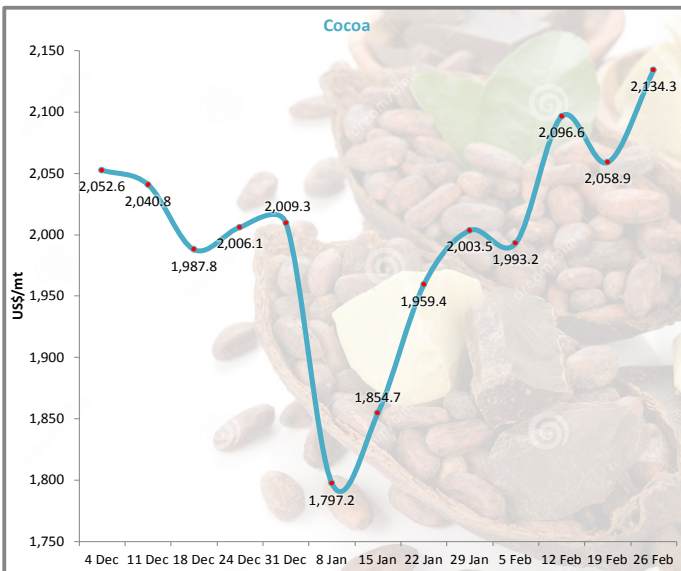
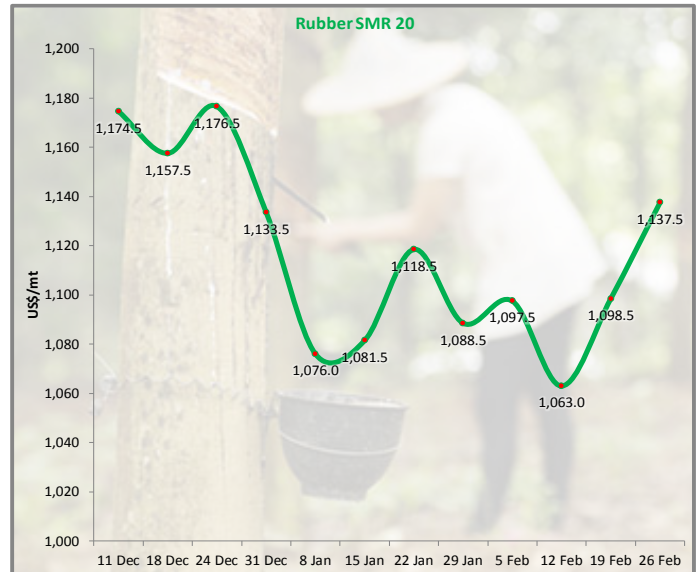
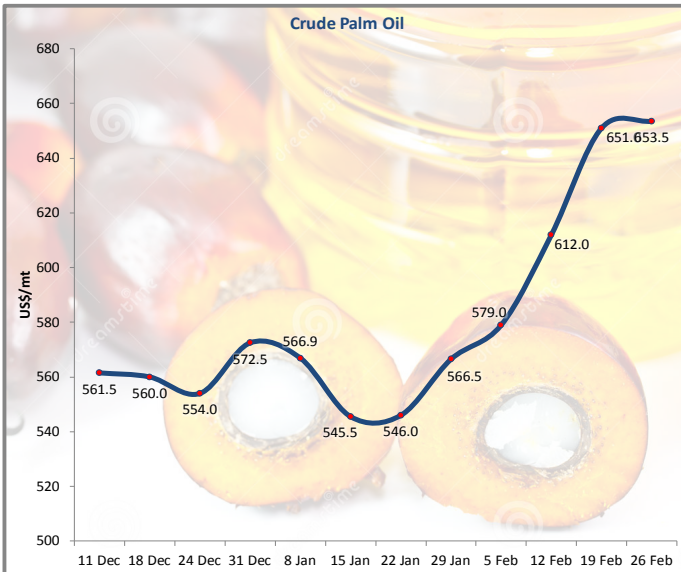


Average Domestic Prices, 26 Feb 2016



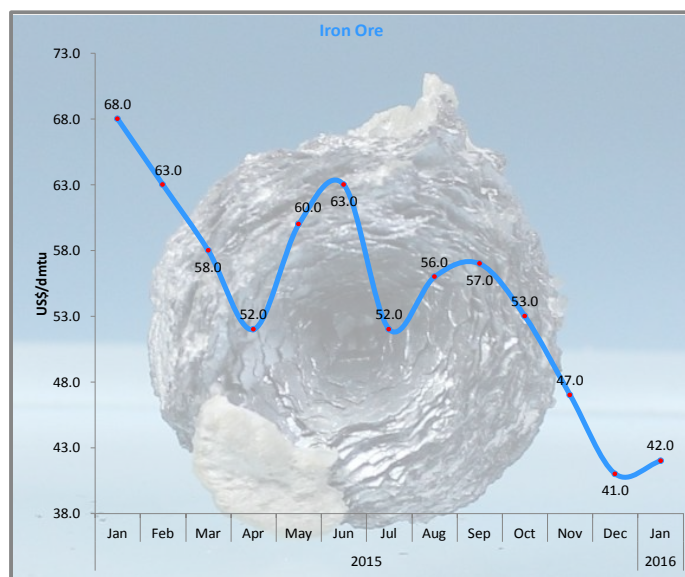
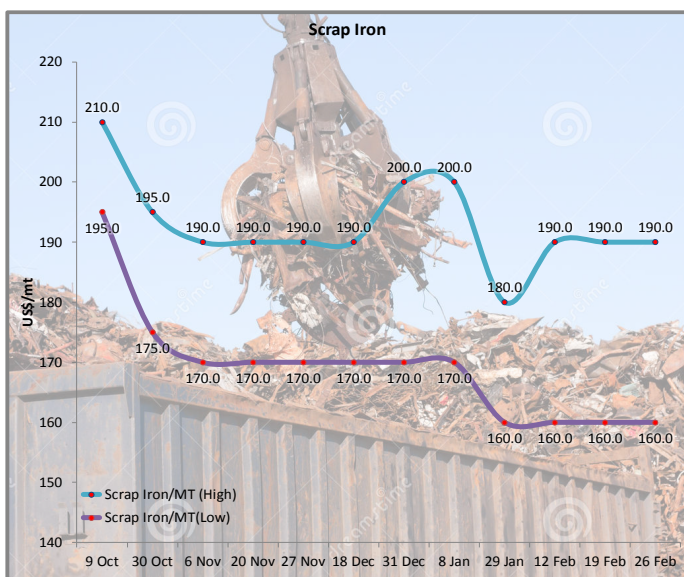
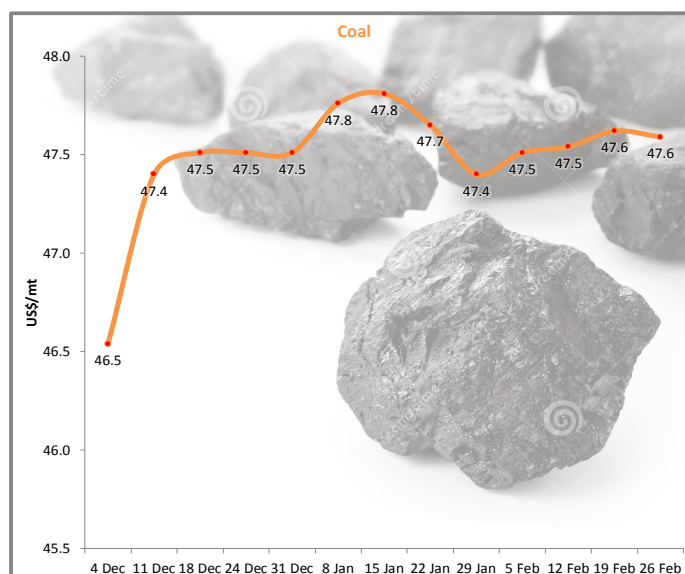
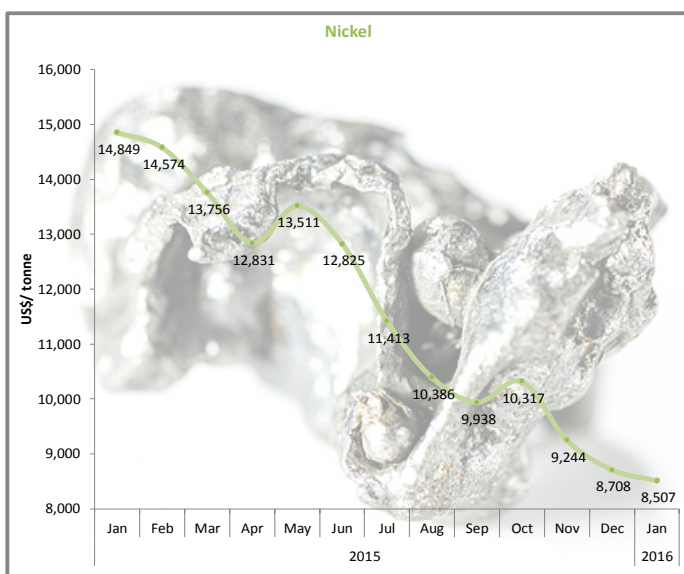
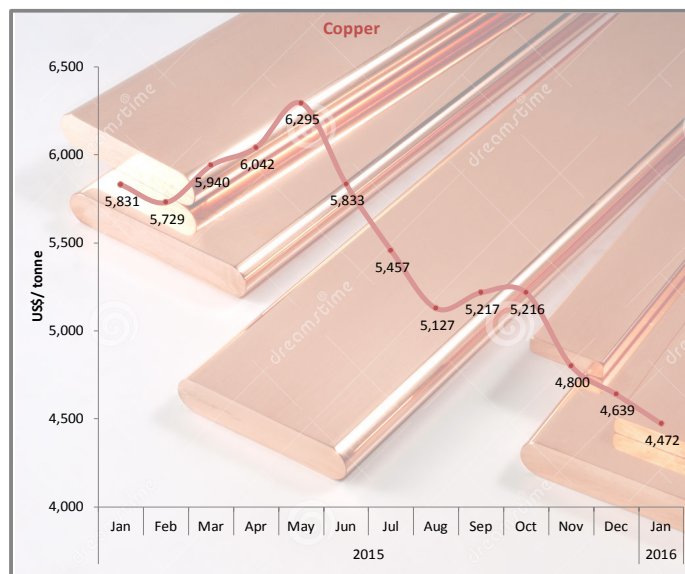
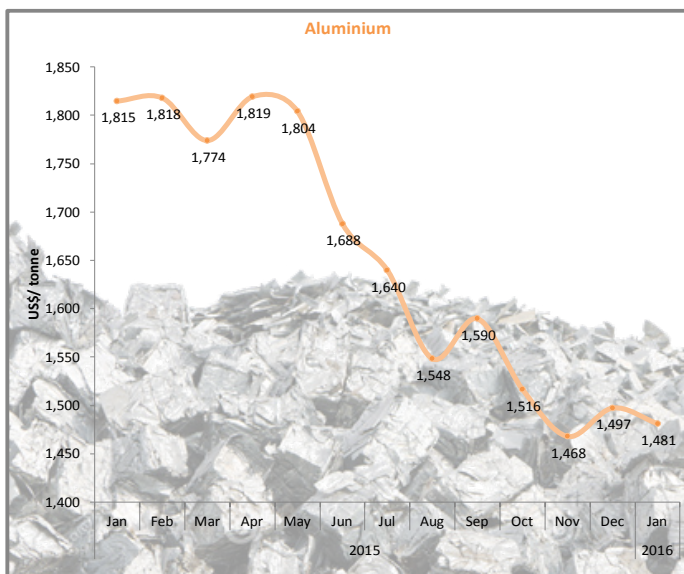

Success Story

NB Poultry Processing Industries Sdn. Bhd. (NB Poultry has all the right ingredients to grow bigger and command greater market share. Under the leadership of its Managing Director, Encik Baharuddin Ahmad, the poultry processor and distributor has grown significantly from its humble beginning in 2006. Started with a small factory in Pontian, Johor, supplying processed chicken, NB Poultry will soon be operating in a modern factory in Senawang, Negeri Sembilan and will increase its capacity to supply chicken parts such as chicken wings, thighs and others under the brand, "NORLIZA".

NB Poultry, which was founded by Encik Baharudin and his wife, Puan Norliza Mohd Yunus on 17 October 2006, has seen its market expanded to the North and East Coast of the Peninsular Malaysia. According to Encik Baharudin, NB Poultry receives high demand for processed chicken and chicken parts from Peninsular Malaysia, Sabah, Sarawak and also as far as Middle East and Russia. When the new factory in Senawang is operational, NB Poultry will have a combined capacity of 90,000 processed chickens a day. Currently, its facility in Pontian is able to produce 40,000 processed chickens a day.

Encik Baharuddin is optimistic that NB Poultry would be able to meet the demand from overseas once its capacity is explained. "Our strength lies in being among a few large Bumiputera companies involved in processed chicken in Johor. Another factor is that our products are halal and the market for halal processed chickens and chicken parts is big in Malaysia as well as abroad," he said, adding that the nine year-old company has the experience in managing the business and dealing with customers which include chicken sellers at the markets and restaurants. The company also processes chickens for other companies. NB Poultry's achievement has enabled it to be selected by Bumiputera Agenda Steering Unit (Teraju) for its Teras (High Performing Bumiputera Companies) programme.

The Teras programme targets Bumiputera-owned companies with growth potential over the next 5 to 10 years. The programme is designed to help high potential Bumiputera companies to scale up, accelerate their growth and compete in the market through merit-based access to opportunities. These companies will be assisted to grow beyond local markets and become regional or global players. Encik Baharudin said in 2013, NB Poultry was awarded Anugerah Penyimpan Setia by Bank Pertanian Malaysia Berhad (Agrobank). In 2009, the company was classified as a 3-star under SME Corporation Malaysia's SCORE rating. SCORE is a diagnostic business performance measurement tool that assigns star ratings to indicate the performance level of the small and medium enterprises (SME's) based on seven assessment criteria such as financial strength, business performance, human resource, technology acquisition and adoption, certification and market presence. NB Poultry which now employs 146 staff, provides various incentives for its employees to motivate them. These include annual bonus, salary increment and several programmes such as the employee award ceremony.

Competition is one of the challenges faced by the company. However, NB Poultry will continue to produce halal and quality processed chickens and chicken parts that meet the customer's needs. On his advice to the young entrepreneurs, Encik Baharudin said, "Each venture that you start has its own challenges, and to succeed, you must be brave and accompanied by knowledge and experience." NB Poultry first established its relations with SME Bank in 2007, when the company was selected for the Agro-based Entrepreneur Programme. The company has also secured Ijarah Thummal Bai' financing facility from SME Bank to finance its plant, machinery and equipment. The financing has contributed positively to NB Poultry's business and its expansion.

Armed with modern plants and equipment as well as dedicated staff, NB Poultry is all geared up to deepen its foothold in the poultry processing and chicken parts sector.
