## MYANMAR'S GATEWAY ISSUES HAS BEEN FIXED: EXCHANGED OF ATIGA E-FORM D TO PORT OF THILAWA AND YANGON, MYANMAR WILL RESUME BACK TO NORMAL

We kindly refer to our announcement (<u>Announcement Myanmar's Gateway Error</u>) published on 24 November 2021 in MITI's portal and e-PCO system.

Please be informed that we have received updates from Myanmar's officials that they **have successfully rectified the technical issues**, and ASEAN Member States (AMS) may now resume the exchange of the ATIGA e-Form D to/or from Myanmar (for port of Yangon and Thilawa).

In this regard, starting from 1 December 2021, all applications of PCO under the ATIGA scheme to Myanmar will resume back to normal where the ASW consent box will be automatically ticked and locked to port Yangon (MMRGN) and Thilawa (MMTLA) to enable the exchange of the ATIGA e-Form D. Exportation to other ports will remain via paper-based ATIGA Form D with electronically affixed signature and seal, until the remaining ports in Myanmar are able to accept ATIGA e-Form D.

## ASEAN SINGLE WINDOW (ASW) CONSENT FOR ATIGA

I hereby agree for the data relating to my application as reflected in the ATIGA Form D, to be uploaded onto the ASEAN Single Window and thereafter be exchanged electronically with ready ASEAN Member States. And I hereby confirm that the information given in this applicant is true, complete and accurate.

Note: Applicant is given with the option whether to accept do not accept the consent

Please find that ATIGA Form D will only be accepted to Thailand for only 55 tarrif lines. For more info, click here

- ii. MITI will reprocess the applications to enable the ATIGA e-Form D to be successfully exchanged to Myanmar.
