



IMPLEMENTATION OF ASEAN WIDE SELF-CERTIFICATION (AWSC)









The <u>First Protocol to Amend the ATIGA</u> (which includes Annex 8 – ATIGA Operatioal Certification Procedure-OCP) shall enter into force <u>30 days after</u> the date on which <u>all ASEAN Member States (AMS)</u> have notified the Secretary-General of ASEAN of the <u>completion of their internal procedures</u>.

Subsequent to this, AMS during the SEOM Preparatory Meeting for the 34th AFTA Council Meeting held on 22-23 August 2020, taking into consideration the final ratification instrument received, <u>agreed</u> to implement the ASEAN-Wide Self Certification (AWSC) effective 20 September 2020.

INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

WHEREAS the First Protocol to Amend the ASEAN Trade in Goods Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "the Protocol") was signed ad-referendum in Hanoi, Viet Nam, on 22 January 2019.

AND WHEREAS Article 2 of the Protocol provides that the Protocol shall enter into force on the thirtieth day after the date on which all Member States have notified the Secretary-General of ASEAN of the completion of their internal procedures.

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of Malaysia, having considered the Protocol, hereby notifies the other Parties of Malaysia's completion of its internal requirements necessary for entry into force of the Protocol.

IN WITNESS THEREOF, this Instrument of Ratification is signed and sealed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia.

DONE at Putrajaya this Thirtieth day of April in this year Two Thousand and Twenty.

Background of ATIGA Self-Certification Scheme

2nd Self-Certification **Pilot Project started** with the participation of 5 Member States namely Indonesia, Lao PDR, the Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam

replaced by AWSC



20 Sept 2020

With the entry into force of the First Protocol to Amend ATIGA on 20 September 2020, the **AWSC Scheme would** be implemented on the same date.



What is AWSC?

AWSC is a <u>trade facilitation initiative</u> that allows exporters who have demonstrated their competence to comply with ATIGA Rules of Origin requirements, known as "Certified Exporters", to <u>self certify the origin</u> <u>status</u> for their goods to be eligible for ATIGA tariff preferences.

AWSC is <u>replacing the current Self-Certification Scheme (SCPP1 and</u> <u>SCPP2)</u>. Once the AWSC is implemented, Certified Exporters (CE) are <u>able to make Origin Declaration</u> for the export of goods to <u>all ASEAN</u> <u>Member States</u>.

To promote this new scheme, ASEAN Secretariat, with support from ASEAN-USAID IGNITE, has initiated some outreach programmes, such as the <u>development of certified exporter database, creating a website</u> <u>on AWSC (awsc.asean.org) and producing brochures and infographics</u> to enhance the awareness of the private sector and relevant government agencies on this new implementation.

GOOD COMPLIANCE MEASURED BY THE RISK MANAGEMENT RULES;

- Existing CE will be <u>informed by MITI in writing</u> on the termination of CE under SCPP1 and <u>authorization</u> to act as CE within the framework of the AWSC <u>effective 20 September 2020</u>
 - The <u>appointment letter</u> will list all the conditions under the OCP that need to be observed by CE:
 - Rule 12A Definition of the Certified Exporter
 - Rule 12B Origin Declaration
 - Rule 12C Monitoring and Verification
 - Rule 12D Withdrawal of the Authorisation
 - Rule 24 Action against fraudulent Acts

OBLIGATION OF A CERTIFIED EXPORTER

- <u>Apply</u> for the necessary <u>Cost Analysis</u> approval from MITI (CA validity is 2 years from date of approval);
- Make out Origin Declarations only for goods for which the CE has been authorised to make out an Origin Declaration and for which the CE has all appropriate documents proving the originating status
- Keep and maintain <u>up-to-date accurate books and record</u>s for <u>at</u> <u>least 3 years;</u>
- <u>**Report**</u> to MITI on numbers of Commercial Invoice Declaration on quarterly basis before 5th of April, July, October and January;



OBLIGATION OF A CERTIFIED EXPORTER

- Extend full co-operation to MITI and Royal Malaysian Customs when <u>required</u> (inspection/audit of operations).
- <u>continue to comply</u> with the conditions set out in <u>Rule 12 A Paragraph 2</u> of the OCP;
- Accept full responsibility for all Origin Declarations made, including any misuse; and
- Promptly inform the Competent Authority of any changes related to the information submitted under **Rule 2 Paragraph 4** of the OCP.



How will the Importing Authority know that I am a Certified **Exporter**?



CE information are stored in a dedicated Database **System** initiated by the ASEAN Secretariat with support from ASEAN-USAID IGNITE.

MITI will need to <u>upload all the CE information</u> into this system using <u>specific format/template</u>.

Hence, it is very **important** for all CE to **make sure** that the information submitted to MITI are accurate to avoid any problem that might cause denial of preferential treatment.





RULE 12B OF THE ATIGA OCP ORIGIN DECLARATION

- The document containing the Origin Declaration should describe the goods in **sufficient details** to enable them to be identified for origin determination purposes.
- The Origin Declaration shall bear the name and manually executed signature of the **authorised signatories**.
- The **date of the document** containing the Origin Declaration shall be **considered** as the issuance date of the Origin Declaration.
- The **reference number of the document** containing the Origin Declaration shall be considered as the reference number of the Origin Declaration.
- If in case the **<u>space provided</u>** for in the Origin Declaration **<u>is not sufficient</u>** to list out all the products, additional page/s containing information as set out in Attachment 1 could be attached.





ORIGIN DECLARATION

- The procedure is similar with the procedure under SCPP1, where the CE shall make the Origin Declaration on their <u>commercial invoice</u>.
- Only in cases where the commercial invoice could not be produced to the importer on the exportation date, the CE is permitted to put the declaration on other trade documents and will be accepted at the time of importation if <u>submitted together with the commercial invoice</u> as follows :
