 Anugerah Malaysia Smart Manufacturing, kini memasuki tahun kedua, terus menjadi pemangkin penting—mengiktiraf kecemerlangan, meraikan inovasi dan mendorong lebih banyak syarikat untuk melaksanakan operasi yang lebih pintar serta berasaskan teknologi.

Continuity with New Industrial Master Plan 2030

Ladies and Gentlemen,

- 3. The **MSMA** is more than award ceremony; it is a checkpoint reminding us how far we have come, and how much further we must go in driving Malaysia's industrial transformation.
- 4. At last year's inaugural MSMA, we underscored digitalisation as a core driver of the New Industrial Master Plan 2030 (NIMP2030). **That call remains as urgent today as it was then.**
- 5. To remain competitive, we must evolve. For example, NIMP 2030's mission to establish 3,000 smart factories is not merely a target, but a pledge to future-proof Malaysia's industry through automation, digital integration, data utilization, and workforce upskilling.

- 6. By honouring excellence in Smart SME, Smart Mid-Tier, Technology Excellence, and People Categories, we celebrate both the pioneers of digital adoption, and the enablers our local technology providers. Above all, we recognise leadership, capability-building, and the human dimension of industrial progress.
 - 7. **The numbers speak for themselves.** I am pleased to share that, since NIMP2030 was launched:
 - a. The manufacturing sector's value added to GDP increased by 13.5% or RM45.3 billion in value, to reach RM382.0 billion in 2024 (cf. RM336.7 billion in 2021). This indicates sustained growth, contributed by higher investments, business expansions, as well as increasing exports.
 - b. Employment increased by 8.5% (or 222,000), reaching 2.84 million in 2024 (cf. 2.62 million in 2021), indicating a steady rise in job opportunities within the industry, including jobs from new realized investments.
 - c. The **median salary** in the manufacturing sector **rose by 26%** to **RM2,490 in 2024** (*cf.* RM1,976 in 2021) indicating improved wage conditions in line with sectoral growth.

Malaysia's Economic Landscape and SME Performance

Ladies and gentlemen,

- 8. The consistent strength of our industrial and manufacturing sector have translated into recent trade performance. From January to October 2025, trade reached RM2.5 trillion, with exports amounting to RM1.3 trillion. These figures reflect the resilience and competitiveness of Malaysian businesses, and the vital role of SMEs in anchoring supply chains, creating jobs, and driving export growth.
- NIMP2030 has also contributed to the 13.2% year-on-year increase in approved investments for January-September 2025, at RM285 billion, set to create over 150,000 jobs for Malaysians.
- 10. Hence, to take advantage of this growth, SME readiness remains a priority. To stay competitive globally, our SMEs must scale, innovate, and venture abroad with access to capital, technology, talent and reliable guidance.

Strengthening SMEs through 'Navigator Global'

11. The merger, the combined strengths of MBSB Group and MIDF have further reinforced support for SME development through various initiatives — making the Navigator Global a timely next step.

- 12. Today, that SME support is accelerated through MBSB's collaboration with Navigator Global and Santander guiding SMEs to scale up with structured insights, tailored export pathways, and trusted service providers.
- 13. By easing regulatory requirements, connecting firms to credible partners, and offering actionable intelligence, the platform enables SMEs to enter new markets with greater clarity and confidence.
- 14. I am also pleased to know that MBSB business customers will enjoy complimentary access to Navigator Global's Standard Package for one year. For SMEs and mid-tier companies, Navigator Global truly complements MITI, MATRADE and our agencies' support. Export success demands readiness, innovation and guidance tools that strengthen preparation and empower growth.

Closing

Ladies and gentlemen,

- 15. I would like to add that **manufacturing** is more than an economic engine; it is **the backbone of our nation's well-being** contributing over one-fifth of GDP and employing millions.
- 16. It sustains livelihoods by **providing millions of jobs**, **anchors supply chains that keep businesses competitive**, and **drives innovation that uplifts communities**.

- 17. Every factory floor, every skilled worker, and every enterprise contributes not only to GDP but to the dignity of families, the resilience of industries, and the confidence of Malaysia's future. When manufacturing thrives, businesses grow, households prosper, and the nation stands prouder, and stronger in the global economy.
- 18. As this is my penultimate day serving as Minister of MITI, today's ceremony holds special meaning to me. From my very first day in MITI, it has been a real privilege to have worked closely with industry partners, agencies, financiers, tech enablers, SMEs and mid-tier firms, to drive Malaysia's industrial transformation. Together we overcame challenges, seized opportunities and reinforced our economic fundamentals. Your collaboration has made this journey deeply meaningful and fulfilling. For that, I express my sincerest gratitude.
- 19. To MIDF, MBSB, Bizsphere, Smart4WRD and all ecosystem partners, thank you for your trust. I urge you to continue supporting MITI and working closely with my successor to advance NIMP 2030, and other sectoral policies.
- 20. To all award recipients and nominees, your achievements prove Malaysia can compete globally thriving through innovation, perseverance, and collaboration. Our nation has so much going for it, and you should be proud to be part of the national movement reshaping Malaysia's manufacturing landscape.

- 21. So, to the organisers of the MSMA 2025, thank you for elevating excellence within Malaysia's SME community. Let us keep building an industrial ecosystem so Malaysia can position itself as a regional hub for smart manufacturing.
